The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April.

## Saturday, April 2

### Driving Under the Influence – 1400 Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 84 MPH in a posted 55 MPH zone. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he drank between 2 to 5 beers and should not be driving. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported and lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## Sunday, April 3

### Disorderly Conduct – 900 Block Carolina Boulevard

Officers responded to a possible burglary in progress. They located a male subject attempting to gain entry into a residence, which was determined not to be his residence. It was determined that the subject was grossly intoxicated and that no one at the residence knew him. The subject was placed under arrest and lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for moving violations and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked if he had been drinking, he indicated that he drank at the bar and then took a drink with him, which was located in the center console. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample of .15% BAC. The driver was then lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Thursday, April 7**

#### **Underage Possession of Alcohol – 100 Block Grand Pavilion**

Officers responded to a report of subjects attempting to break into parked vehicles and located two subjects. It was determined that the two subjects were juveniles who were intoxicated and located the liquor bottle from which they had been drinking. The juveniles were charged and released to their parent.

#### **False Pretense/Swindle – 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that a company he has been doing business with for several years contacted him regarding money they owed him. He stated that they deposited a sum of money into his account, and then requested that he return a portion of that money through Western Union. After doing as requested, he discovered that the company withdrew the entire amount that had been deposited from his account, which resulted in the theft of approximately \$650. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Friday, April 8**

#### **Underage Possession of Alcohol – Area of Grand Pavilion**

Officers responded to a report of a loud party and a subject urinating from the balcony at the back of the residence. Officers made contact with the subjects, who after coming to speak with the officers at the front door, then attempted to shut the door when it was determined that the subjects were under 21 years old. Officers observed several subjects scrambling around inside the residence and entered the house. Further investigation revealed copious amounts of alcohol and five subjects were placed under arrest.

### **Saturday, April 9**

#### **Driving Under the Influence – 2100 Palm Boulevard**

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample of .14% BAC. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Saturday, April 16**

#### **Driving Under the Influence – 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard**

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and upon making contact with the driver determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that she had drunk one or two drinks a couple of hours ago. The officer requested the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the completion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## **Sunday, April 17**

### **Disorderly Conduct** – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer on foot patrol was called over by a bouncer at a local establishment in reference to a disorderly female who was refusing to leave. The officer made contact with the female and escorted her out of the establishment, where she became belligerent, yelling profanity, telling the officer to just take her to jail because it was on her bucket list. The officer placed the female under arrest and lodged her in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Simple Possession of Marijuana** – Municipal Parking Lot B

An officer patrolling the Municipal Parking Lot got out with a suspicious vehicle and detected the odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The occupants admitted to have marijuana and relinquished it to the officer, who placed the suspect under arrest. The suspect was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## **Monday, April 18**

### **Breach of Trust** – Seagrass Lane

A victim reported that two contractors hired to remodel his residence, but have failed to complete work that has been billed and paid. The victim reports that he has currently paid out approximately \$14,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **False Pretense/Swindle** – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that they received an email from the Isle of Palms Clerk of Court Office advising that he owed \$1,315.75. The victim confirmed that no one from the Clerk of Court Office had sent him an email. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Petit Larceny** – Waterway Island Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his dock box containing a battery charger and other miscellaneous items. The approximate value of the items taken is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

## **Friday, April 22**

### **Driving Under the Influence** – 3500 Block of Hartnett Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a vehicle striking a tree, but determined that no collision had occurred and the occupants had fled the scene. Officers located the subjects, discovered that both possibly under the influence. Further investigation determined the female subject had been driving. The officer requested that she perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at their completion, she was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she provided a breath sample of .33% BAC. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Saturday, April 23**

**Burglary – Sandpiper Court**

A victim reported that his daughter and her acquaintance entered into his residence and stole three (3) handguns. The victim was able to provide the serial numbers for the weapons and they were all entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the weapons stolen is \$3,895. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Sunday, April 24**

**Driving Under the Influence – Ocean Boulevard / 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated the he drank a couple of beers. The officer requested the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample with a .18% BAC. The driver was lodged.

**Burglary – 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into their unlocked rental home and stole several items to include, purses, book bags, identification, laptop and other items. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$4,304. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Tuesday, April 26**

**Petit Larceny – Ocean Boulevard / Sea Cabins**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bicycle that had been secured to a tree. The approximate value of the bicycle is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1000 Palm Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her purse that had been left on the front seat of her car while she was out running errands. The approximate value of the purse and contents is approximately \$869. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Wednesday, April 27**

**Motor Vehicle Theft – 100 Block Charleston Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his vehicle, which was unlocked with the keys inside. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$13,000. The vehicle was entered into NCIC as stolen and this case is assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Friday, April 29**

**Warrant Arrest – Grand Pavilion**

An officer stopped a golf cart for disregarding multiple stop signs. The officer checked the status of the driver's license and was informed that he had an outstanding warrant for larceny with Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The driver was arrested and transferred to the Charleston County Sheriff's Office.

#### Simple Possession Marijuana – IOP Connector

An officer got out with a suspicious subject who was standing over the safety wall on the ledge above the water. The officer was able to get the subject back over the railing to safety and saw that the subject had a baggie of marijuana sticking out of his pocket. The subject was arrested and lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Saturday, April 30

#### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 70 MPH in a posted 55 MPH speed zone. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated he only drank one beer after work. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Testing and upon completion, was arrested. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The subject was lodged.

#### Liquor Law Violation – 1300 Ocean Boulevard

An officer checked on a suspicious vehicle and located two subjects sleeping inside. Further investigation revealed that the subjects had an open bottle of liquor. It was also determined that one of the subjects had an arrest warrant with the Charleston Police Department for failure to appear for gambling charges. The subject was placed under arrest and transferred to the Charleston Police Department.

#### Personnel Recognition

#### Community Service Activities

April 19 – Pfc. James Couche assisted a visitor from Mount Pleasant with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

April 20 – Pfc. Louise Hardy coordinated a Coffee With A Cop event at The Refuge restaurant. During the event, approximately ten (10) citizens came by to interact with the officers.
