The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of February.

Tuesday, February 2

Petit Larceny – 3700 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that at some time during the day while he was working, an unknown person(s) took tools from inside his vehicle. The approximate value of the items taken is \$600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, February 6

Petit Larceny – 100- Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer observed a subject walking on the sidewalk carrying a street sign. When the Officer attempted to make contact with the subject, he went down a driveway and the Officer was unable to locate him, but was able to recover the street sign along with another street sign. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, February 7

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 23rd Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving and an equipment violations. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated he drank two beers at a friend's house while watching the Super Bowl. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which resulted in him being placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample with results of .13% BAC. Additionally, the driver was charged with an open container violation and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, February 8

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 7th Avenue

An Officer responded to a report of a vehicle that had hit a street sign and was driving erratically. The Officer located the vehicle, was able to observe the erratic driving and stopped the vehicle. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he had not been drinking, nor was he on any medications. The Officer requested the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which resulted in him being placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample with results of .28% BAC. Additionally, the driver was charged with leaving the scene with property damage and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, February 9

Traffic Stop/Warrant Arrest – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had an outstanding arrest warrant with the Escambia County Sheriff's Office in Florida for armed robbery with a weapon. The warrant was confirmed; the driver was arrested, and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center to await extradition.

Saturday, February 13

Burglary – Sandcrab Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had broken into her home and moved several items around and then stole stereo equipment. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$150. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Simple Assault – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a local establishment for a fight in progress. When they arrived, they saw several subjects shoving each other and immediately separated them. Further investigation revealed that an argument began between two male subjects. As one of the subjects started to leave, the other subject punched him in the face, which was not observed by the Officers. The victim ultimately decided that he did not wish to pursue charges against the person that punched him.

Monday, February 15

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer observed a vehicle to be speeding on Palm Boulevard, 45 MPH in a posted 35 MPH speed zone. The Officer stopped the vehicle and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he only had one beer in the last couple of hours. The Officer requested the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which resulted in him being placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. Additionally, the driver was charged with an open container violation and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, February 16

Driving Under the Influence – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

An Officer observed a vehicle parked in the state right of way and that the driver was slumped over with the vehicle's engine still running. The Officer woke up the driver and determined that she was possibly under the influence. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which resulted in her being placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she was unable to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Friday, February 19

Fraud – 31st Avenue

A victim reported that he received pop up messages on his computer claiming to be a Microsoft associate. The message indicated that the computer has multiple viruses and that he would have to pay to have them removed. The victim provided the unknown person with approximately \$25,000 to remove the viruses, but this did not occur. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Domestic Violence – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

Officers responded to report of a woman yelling for help. Officers patrolled the area, located the woman and observed a male subject lying on the ground, holding a laptop and other items. Further investigation revealed that the couple were having domestic issues and had been drinking. It was determined that during their conversation, it became hostile, with the male subject attempting to leave. The woman tackled the male and wrapped a phone cable around his neck. During interactions with the officers, the woman was uncooperative and refused to provide any information. Because of the situation, she was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Traffic Offense – 41st Avenue

An Officer stopped a golf cart for driving on the roadway after dark. Contact with the driver and passenger revealed that they had open containers and that the driver had a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, February 20

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 27th Avenue / Hartnett Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of three suspicious subjects who attempted to break into a vehicle. Officers were able to establish a perimeter with the assistance of a Sullivan's Island Police Officer and two Charleston County Sheriff's Deputies. Officers located three male subjects who were attempting to get into a parked vehicle. Investigation revealed that there was marijuana in the vehicle and other items located that were identified by local victims as their property. All three subjects were placed under arrest. During an interview with one of the subjects, he indicated that they had come over to IOP to break into cars because "they are always unlocked and have valuables inside." The subjects were transported to Al Cannon Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer responded to a report of a vehicle speeding and passing cars on the IOP Connector. The Officer located the vehicle, with the driver inside and still running, parked at a local shopping center. The Officer requested the driver's license, but instead, the driver got out of the vehicle and was observed to be possibly under the influence. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety tests, which resulted in him being placed under arrest. The driver became aggressive, kicking the door and attempting to move the handcuffs to the front, so he was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where he refused to remain seated, follow any other instructions and refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, February 21

Driving Under Suspension – IOP Connector

An Officer was patrolling the IOP Connector for a reported DUI driver. The Officer observed a vehicle matching the description given and turned around to follow and observe the vehicle. The driver pulled over into the break down lane without being directed to do so by the Officer. When the Officer stopped and got out with the driver, the driver asked what was going on. The Officer explained the situation and requested his driver's license and vehicle registration. The driver refused to provide any information, at which time the driver was placed under arrest, charged with DUS 3rd Offense, Hindering and NRVC. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Burglary – 9500 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered her residence and stole her engagement and wedding rings. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$83,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, February 26

Grand Larceny – Yacht Harbor Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a diamond ring from his residence during the time that construction workers were present. The approximate value of the item taken is \$4500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, February 27

Petit Larceny – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown person stole the sign from in front of a local establishment. The approximate value of the item is \$120. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Personnel Recognition

Command Staff commends Pfc. Storen for his being selected as the Officer of the Quarter for the third quarter of 2015 by the SC Law Enforcement Network. During the this quarter, Pfc. Storen conducted a total of two hundred and five (205) traffic stops, making nine (9) arrests for Driving Under the Influence.

Pfc. Storen consistently leads the Department in DUI arrests, totaling forty-seven (47) for 2015 while still performing other patrol responsibilities such as building checks, conducting Special Patrol Requests and responding to calls for service from the community.

We would also like to recognize Tracy Waldron, who fulfills several rolls within the Department. She is the Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police, but also handles all records requests from the public and attorneys. She also fulfills requests from within the Department for various reports and other administrative functions that keeps us moving forward. She will also assist the Communications Specialists in the Reception Office.

Community Service Activities

During the month of February 2016, Officers issued twenty-two (22) "Property Security Check Notices" and zero (0) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

February 6 – Sergeant Jamey Meekins, ACO Chris Enourato, BSO Butch Skinner, and BSO Daniel Tyson attended Doggie Day at the IOP Recreation Department. The Officers set up a table to issue dog licenses for 2016. During the event, sixty-nine (69) dog licenses were sold.

February 16 – Pfc. James Taylor assisted a visitor from Charleston with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

February 24 – Pfc. Dylan Reynolds assisted a visitor from Charleston with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

February 26 – Pfc. Amanda Postell assisted a visitor from Jacksonville, Florida with the education, installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

February 26 – Pfc. Amanda Postell went to the IOP Recreation Department for a "Kids & Cops" session where she talked to the children about bicycle safety. The group had their bicycle helmets and Pfc. Postell assisted them with the proper way to wear their helmets and then went outside to instruct on riding safely.

February 27 – Pfc. Amanda Postell assisted a visitor from Mount Pleasant with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

February 27 – Pfc. Amanda Postell assisted a visitor from Daniel Island with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.
