The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March.

Friday, March 4

Driving Under the Influence -27th Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence when he handed the Officer his Costco card and not his driver's license. When asked if he had been drinking, the driver indicated that he had a few drinks. During the Officer's investigation, the driver attempted to walk away and was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, March 5

Simple Possession of Marijuana – Seagrove Lane

An Officer responding to a noise complaint for loud music and upon making contact with the person responsible for the residence determined that she was intoxicated and under 21 years old. Further investigation revealed that several subjects inside the residence had fled. The Officer located another subject, who was also intoxicated and under 21 years old inside the residence. In addition, the Officer found several open beer cans, Jell-O shots, liquor, a fake identification card, drug paraphernalia and a quantity of marijuana in plain view. The subjects were arrested and charged.

Sunday, March 6

Drug/Narcotic Violation – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and upon contact with the driver, observed that he was possibly under the influence. The driver was asked to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, at which time it was determined that he was under the influence of illegal narcotics. The driver told the Officer that his vehicle could be searched, where marijuana, drug paraphernalia, and Schedule II Controlled Substance was located. The driver was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer responded to a collision in the parking lot of the shopping center. During the investigation of the collision, it was determined that the driver of one of the vehicles was possibly under the influence. When asked, she denied consuming any alcohol. The driver was asked to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Testing and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample with a 0.18% BAC. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, March 8

Petit Larceny – 3300 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons entered onto her property and stole two bicycles that were near the side of her house. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, March 9

Burglary – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons entered into the room where they were staying and stole their prescription medications. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$20. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, March 10

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence of alcohol. When asked, the driver admitted drinking several mixed drinks during the night and that she should not be driving. The driver was asked to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Testing and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample with a 0.17% BAC. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, March 11

Driving Under Suspension – Palm Boulevard / 42 Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for moving violations. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license, unpaid traffic citations, no vehicle insurance, and a vehicle license plate that did not belong to him. The driver was placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, March 13

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Dunecrest Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons entered into her unlocked vehicle and stole a pair of sunglasses and money. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$108. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, March 14

Simple Possession of Marijuana – 1100 Block Pavilion Drive

During an investigation of a subject sleeping inside a vehicle, an Officer smelled burnt marijuana. When asked, the subject admitted that he had just “hot boxed” his car and that the remaining marijuana was located inside a bag on the front passenger side seat. The subject was placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, March 18

Petit Larceny – Twin Oaks Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons stole an air compressor from his residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$129. This case was assigned to CID and during their investigation, the item was located at a local pawnshop and was able to return it to the owner. The investigation continues.

Simple Possession of Marijuana – IOP Connector

An Officer responded to a complaint of a suspicious person walking close to traffic on the IOP Connector. Upon making contact with the subject, she threw a box over the side of the Connector, at which time the Officer detained her. Further investigation and retrieval of the item that was thrown over the Connector, it was determined that it contained marijuana. The subject refused to cooperate and provide her information. She placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, March 19

Petit Larceny – 2700 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons stole his fishing rod and reel that had been leaning against the fence in his yard. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$175. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, March 20

Credit Card Fraud – 5800 Palmetto Drive

A victim reported an unknown person claiming to be hotel front desk staff contacted him. The subject told the victim that he needed his credit card information due to it being in their computer system. The victim became suspicious and contacted the front desk about the call, finding that the subject had stolen his information. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, March 23

Petit Larceny – 5800 Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to a report of female subject threatening an employee of the resort. Upon making contact with the victim, it was determined that the subject’s credit card had been declined and she refused to pay her outstanding debt of approximately \$200. The subject was placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center. It was also determined that she had active arrest warrants with the Myrtle Beach Police Department, who requested a hold be placed on the subject.

Friday, March 25

Petit Larceny – Ocean Club Villas

A victim reported that unknown persons entered into the owner’s closet of their rental unit and stole several kitchen items. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$255. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, March 28

Drug/Narcotic Violations – 41st Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. During the stop, the Officer noted that the driver and passengers were nervous, shaking uncontrollably and breathing heavily. The Officer asked to search the vehicle and was given permission. Subsequently, the Officer located drug paraphernalia and crack cocaine inside the vehicle. The subjects were placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, March 29

Open Container – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation. Upon making contact with the driver, the Officer saw open cans of beer in the center console. Both the driver and passenger were placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Wednesday, March 30

Motor Vehicle Theft – Sandpiper Court

A victim reported that he allowed his friend to use his car to go to the store and after twenty-four hours, the subject never returned the vehicle. The victim attempted to contact his friend with no success. The vehicle has been entered as stolen into NCIC and this case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Beach Alcohol Enforcement

During the month, Officers patrolled the beach and charged ten (10) persons for violating the City’s ordinance preventing alcohol on the beach.

Chad King attended Lunch Buddies at SIES, talking with children from Pre-K to Fifth Grade. Several of the teachers commented on how much the students love the Lunch Buddies program, looking forward to our next visit.
