The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October.

## Tuesday, October 1

### Petit Larceny – 7000 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that an unknown person stole two bicycles that were located outside the entrance to her residence. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$455. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

## Wednesday, October 2

### Petit Larceny – Area of 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons stole his flatbed trailer that had been parked in a gated parking area. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$800. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

## Thursday, October 3

### Shoplifting – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons entered the convenience store and stole several cans of beer. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$10. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

## Friday, October 4

### Credit Card Fraud – 100 Block Sparrow Drive

A victim reported that she had lost her pocketbook containing several credit and debit cards and that unknown person(s) had made unauthorized charges on her cards. The approximate amount of charges made to her cards was \$4,750. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Saturday, October 5**

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – Area of 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons entered into his unlocked vehicle parked in his driveway and stole a generator and chain saw. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – Area of Oyster Row

A victim reported that unknown persons entered into his unlocked vehicle parked in his driveway and removed a GPS and case containing a bow and arrows. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1,110. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Sunday, October 6**

#### **Burglary** – Area of Surf Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons broke into his residence and stole several televisions from the residence after Hurricane Matthew. CID was called out to process the crime scene and collect evidence. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,600. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Burglary** – 3600 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons broke into his residence and stole several televisions, stereo components and a DVD player. CID was called out to process the crime scene and collect evidence. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$625. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Wednesday, October 9**

#### **Petit Larceny** – 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Public Beach Access

A victim reported that unknown persons stole his skateboard, which he had placed on top of a dune located at 9th Avenue, and then went for a walk. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$130. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Simple Possession of Marijuana** – IOP Connector

After Hurricane Matthew, officers were stationed at the IOP Connector only allowing residents onto the island. During this time, a subject in a vehicle failed to stop as directed. An officer located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license and the passenger was in possession of marijuana. Both subjects were charged and given a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

### **Wednesday, October 16**

#### **Public Intoxication** – Area of Sandshell Court

A victim reported that he found an unknown subject passed out in the backseat of his unlocked truck. The officer made contact with the subject and determined that subject was extremely intoxicated and was assisted back to where he was staying. The subject was charged and given a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Simple Assault – JC Long Boulevard

A victim reported that he had taken his dog to a local establishment and met a female subject who after being asked not to, continued to feed his dog pieces of a sandwich. When the victim was leaving, the woman again tried to feed his dog and he told her to stop. The female then walked over to him scratched the top of his hand, causing it to bleed and then shoved him in his chest. The victim then left the establishment and contacted law enforcement. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Traffic Offense – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and made contact with the driver who was unable to provide a driver's license. Further investigation revealed that the driver did not possess any valid driver's license. The driver was charged and given a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Thursday, October 17

Grand Larceny – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons stole his boat that was docked in its slip. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$20,000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, October 19

Vandalism – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons damaged the security gate at the entrance to the Yacht Harbor Marina. The approximate value of the damage is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Underage Possession of Alcohol – Palm Boulevard / Charleston Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver, who was under the age of 21, had several containers of beer inside the vehicle. The driver was charged and given a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

A victim reported that unknown persons bent the door handle on her front door. The approximate amount of damage is \$260. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, October 22

Petit Larceny – 100 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons stole his kayak and other items from his dock located across from his residence. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,340. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Monday, October 28**

**False Pretense/Swindle – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that a male subject, who was renting his home, presented him with a check that was returned for insufficient funds. Further investigation revealed that the subject had three outstanding arrest warrants with our agency for the same offense. Officers were able to locate the subject, placed him under arrest and transported him to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard**

A victim reported that he saw a male subject going through his unlocked truck and confronted him. The subject left in a vehicle that was located in Mt. Pleasant by one of our officers. The officer coordinated with Mt. Pleasant Police Department to make contact with the subject. The subject was arrested by Mt. Pleasant Police Department on unrelated charges. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Domestic Violence – 9000 Block Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to report of an in progress domestic violence situation. Officers made contact with the female subject, who reported that she awoke to her husband hitting her in the face and bloodied her nose. The male subject was located and admitted to hitting her in the face. He was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

A victim reported that unknown persons entered into her parked vehicle and stole her purse that contained cash. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$85. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.
