The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of November 2010.

## Patrol

November 1, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue where a possible domestic dispute was reported by a third party. Officers spoke to both subjects who confirmed they had been arguing, but no physical contact was involved. The incident was only verbal in nature, and both parties agreed that they had things worked out for the remainder of the evening.

November 2, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue after observing that none of the three occupants were wearing a seatbelt. The officer determined that the driver did not have a license to operate a vehicle and was charged with No Driver's License, No Insurance, and No Seatbelt. The passengers were cited for No Seatbelt.

November 4, 2010 A citizen reported a reckless driver on the Connector that proceeded onto Palm Boulevard. The vehicle was located and identified, and the determination was made that the driver had an outstanding Arrest Warrant for Contempt of Court through the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The driver was taken into custody and released to a Charleston County Deputy.

November 9, 2010 An officer on patrol observed a vehicle on Palm Boulevard that appeared to be speeding, the vehicle then turned onto the Connector, and pulled over to the shoulder where the passenger door opened. When the officer observed this he stopped to investigate. The vehicle drove away, then pulled over to the shoulder again and again the passenger door opened. The officer approached the vehicle to get the attention of the driver, who was unable to provide the proper paperwork for the vehicle. Since the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol he asked the driver to exit the vehicle. The driver had to use the vehicle for support and performed poorly on several Field Sobriety Tests. The driver was transported to police headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test, where he registered a .15% level of alcohol. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

November 13, 2010 While an officer was responding to a reported accident at the intersection of Palm Boulevard and 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue he was advised by dispatch that one of the vehicles involved had left the scene driving north on Palm Boulevard. While responding, the officer encountered the suspect vehicle at the corner of Hartnett Boulevard and 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue with fresh front end damage and stopped it. While speaking to the driver, the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol. The driver had difficulty standing and performed poorly for several Filed Sobriety Tests given at that location. He was transported to the Police Department and administered a Datamaster Test, which registered a .32% of alcohol in his system. He was charged with DUI, Leaving the Scene of an Accident, and Open Container and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

November 14, 2010 While on patrol of the Front Beach, an officer observed a male subject arguing with management on the front porch of an establishment. The officer determined that the suspect had been asked to leave the premises for being a nuisance to other customers. The officer approached the suspect, determined that he was extremely intoxicated and had no one to assist him in leaving the area. Due to his inability to care for himself he was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication.

November 19, 2010 Officers responded to Sparrow Drive where a citizen reported a female in the street yelling. An officer encountered a couple in a parked vehicle and made the determination that they had been in the street arguing just prior to the officer's arrival. Both parties agreed to resolve their issues and not cause any further problems for the rest of the evening.

November 19, 2010 An officer responded to the area of Palmetto Drive near Twin Oaks Lane where an accident had been reported. The officer determined that the incident was an auto pedestrian incident. The injuries to the pedestrian were minor, and the driver of the vehicle was charged with Failure to Yield to a Pedestrian.

November 21, 2010 An officer responded to a condominium unit on Palmetto Drive to investigate a complaint of loud noise coming from a unit. The officer investigated and located the two female subjects who were responsible. The officer made the determination that both were under the age of 21 and in possession of a quantity of beer. Both were charged with Underage Possession of Beer.

November 24, 2010 A male subject reported that he was assaulted by two male subjects near the Exchange Club on Palm Boulevard, and that they had stolen his cellular telephone. This incident has been assigned to an Investigator for follow-up.

November 26, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a bicyclist on 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue to speak to the rider and determined that he was wanted by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. He was taken into custody and released to the custody of a Charleston County Deputy.

November 26, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue where a family member reported that her daughter was suicidal. Once the officers arrived they were advised

that the subject had just left the residence running through a neighbor's backyard and was in possession of a steak knife. All available officers conducted a thorough search of the area, but called off the search when a family member reported that they had made contact with the female and she was being taken to a local hospital for evaluation.

November 26, 2010 An officer responded to Palm Boulevard & 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue to investigate an accident. The officer spoke to both drivers and witnesses and determined that the female driver of the vehicle at fault was under the influence of alcohol. After performing poorly on several Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was taken to headquarters to be administered a Datamaster Test, where she refused to provide a sample. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the County Detention Center.

November 27, 2010 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for speeding, the officer made contact with the driver who was in possession of a route restricted license, due to previous narcotic convictions. The driver was taken into custody for Driving Under Suspension. A pill bottle was located in the front seat area and found to contain a white rock substance and green plant material which later tested positive as cocaine and marijuana. Also located in the vehicle was a Glock .40 caliber handgun. The driver was charged with Speeding, DUS, Illegal Transport of Liquor, Simple Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Cocaine, and Unlawful Carrying of a Pistol. The driver was transported to the Detention Center to await a Bond Hearing.

November 29, 2010 As a result of an investigation into missing funds from a local business an employee was charged with Breach of Trust (over \$2,000). The Investigator made an arrangement with the suspects attorney to turn herself in at the Charleston County Detention Center for processing and a Bond Hearing.

### Personnel/Community Relations

November 6, 2010 PFC Baldrick, who is a Certified Child Safety Seat Officer, installed a child safety seat at police headquarters for a resident.

November 10, 2010 PFC Chavez received a letter of appreciation from a citizen who inquired about transporting a newly purchased boat and trailer from Connecticut to South Carolina. PFC Chavez researched the requirements from out of state police agencies and provided the helpful information to the citizen.

November 30, 2010 For the month of November, officers discovered three businesses and four homes with open or unsecured doors. Three Victim of Crime Forms were issued to homeowners for various violations noted, and one Property Security Check Form to advise business or homeowners that an officer checked their property during the night.


