The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of November, 2011.

(November 3: Thursday )

Officers responded to a local church in reference to a complaint of vandalism. The complainant reported that juveniles have been entering into the playground area and once therein, throw toys all over the area, tangle the swings and damaging playground structures. According to church officials, this has been an on-going problem. Witnesses were able to identify the juveniles. Officers met with the parents of the suspects, who in turn made arrangements with the church. The complainant did not wish to pursue charges.

(November 5: Saturday)

The victim reported that he observed six individuals, between the ages of 13-16 years of age on his property, destroying his tangerine tree. The victim advised Officers that he confronted the group and was told by the suspects that they were visiting the Isle of Palms from Charlotte, North Carolina. The victim does not wish to pursue charges, should the suspects be located and agree to pay restitution for the damages.

(November 6: Sunday)

While on route patrol, an Officer observed a vehicle traveling in Wild Dunes with inoperable equipment. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle was Driving Under Suspension. The subject was charged accordingly.

Officers responded to a residence located in the 3100 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a report of a fire. Officers confirmed that a fire had started in an exterior grill. Isle of Palms Fire Department responded to the scene to extinguish the fire.

(November 7: Monday)

While on route patrol of the 700 block of Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed the driver of a vehicle in violation of the seatbelt law. The Officer conducted a traffic stop and discovered that the driver of the vehicle was Driving Under Suspension and had an outstanding bench warrant for Failure to Pay a Traffic Fine. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(November 9: Wednesday)

Officers met with the property manager and homeowner of an Ocean Boulevard property listed as for sale, in reference to a Burglary. The property manager reported that shortly after she arrived at the residence, she observed a number of flat screened televisions missing, as well as a DVD player. An Investigator responded to the scene and was able to locate and lift latent fingerprints. There were no indications of forced entry into the residence. However, the property manager stated that she believes the door leading into the residence from the garage had been left unsecured. The residence was shown to potential buyers on or about 11/08/11 by an outside real estate company.

(November 10: Thursday)

Officers responded to Gate 2 of Wild Dunes in reference to a call for assistance from Wild Dunes security. Upon arrival, Officers met with security personnel who were out with a disoriented white male subject. A check through local and national databases produced information that the subject had been reported as missing and endangered from Olar, South Carolina. The appropriate authorities were contacted and advised that the subject had been located, as was being transported to the East Cooper Medical Center for a medical evaluation.

(November 11: Friday)

Officers met with a victim in reference to a Grand Larceny. The complainant is employed by a construction company and stated that he secured the equipment on the construction site at approximately 6:00 pm on 11/10/11, when he departed the location. When he returned for work at 8:30 am on 11/11/11, he discovered six ladders and a piece of scaffolding to have been stolen.

While on route patrol on Waterway Boulevard in the area of Timber Lane, an Officer observed a vehicle being operated by an individual not wearing his seatbelt. A traffic stop was conducted, at which time it was determined that the passenger had also failed to deploy their seatbelt. Through the preliminary investigation, it was learned that the operator of the vehicle was Driving Under Suspension, had two active bench warrants for Failure to Pay a Traffic Fine, had failed to register the vehicle in South Carolina and did not have an active insurance policy covering the vehicle. Additionally, the passenger of the vehicle was in possession of a driver's license belonging to another person. Both occupants were placed under arrest. A search of the vehicle during a pre-tow inventory produced a metal pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana. Both subjects were transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Unknown person(s) stole the victims' utility trailer, described as being a black in color, 12 ft. x 5 ft. open trailer with a wooden bottom and large metal rear. The victim reported last seeing the trailer on 11/10/11 at 4:00 pm.

A victim reported that he had been contacted by an individual claiming to be a representative of the Department of Financial Investigators, and in need of further information regarding a loan the victim had acquired. The subject advised the victim that he needed to make a \$100.00 payment, via credit card, which he (the victim did). The victim contacted the loan company, shortly thereafter, and was advised that no one from the loan company had contacted him to request a payment.

(November 12: Saturday)

Officers responded to a possible Burglary, where the witness reported observing a number of male subjects entering into the shed of the unoccupied residence. Upon arrival, Officers located and positively identified four subjects in the shed, with marijuana in their possession. The homeowner was contacted and advised Officers that she did not wish to pursue charges, since nothing was taken and there was no damage to her property.

On 11/12/11 at approximately 10:23 pm, a victim contacted the Victim Advocate to report that she (the victim) and her husband had just had a physical altercation. The Victim Advocate contacted Telecommunications to have Officers dispatched to the residence. The victim reported to Officers that she and her husband were involved in a verbal altercation during which time she slapped him with an open hand. Subsequently, the male subject restrained her and pushed her down. The female subject was uncooperative and did not bear any physical manifestations of injury. The male subject had fled the scene prior to the arrival of Officers.

Officers responded to a residence in reference to a Domestic Dispute. The husband and wife were separated and interviewed. Both stated that the female subject slapped the male subject with an open-hand after he referred to her (female subject) using a profane term during a verbal altercation between the two. At the time Officers were on scene, neither subject bore any physical manifestations of injury.

(November 13: Sunday)

Officers responded to the residence of the domestic dispute that was reported on 11/12/11, in reference to a possible suicide attempt. The female subject reported that her husband had taken a quantity of her prescription medication in an attempt to end his life. The male subject was transported to a local hospital for treatment and evaluation.

(November 16: Wednesday)

The victim reported that his business was contracted to conduct work at a residence on the island. During the time his employees were making repairs to the residence, several power tools were stolen. Shortly after the items were stolen, several employees did not report back to work. Through investigation, there was enough probable cause established to link the stolen property to one of the employees. Consequently, an arrest warrant was prepared for his arrest.

The property manager of a rental property reported that unknown person(s) entered into a rental residence and attempted to gain forceful entry into a secured owner's closet. The perpetrators were unsuccessful in gaining entry into the closet. Nothing else in the residence appeared to be disturbed or missing.

A local business owner reported that an employee utilized funds from the business account for personal unauthorized purchases and monetary advancements.

(November 17: Thursday)

The victim reported that he and his family left to go to the beach at approximately 1730 hrs., leaving his Razor Ripstick in the driveway of the residence. Thirty minutes later, the victim's wife returned to the residence and noticed the property missing.

(November 19: Saturday)

After receiving a series of unwanted text messages from her ex-boyfriend, the victim contacted the police department. The victim advised Officers that her ex-boyfriend has violent tendencies, suffers from a medical condition; however, is cognizant that a court issued restraining order expired the day prior.

(November 20: Sunday)

An Officer on route patrol in the area of Palm Boulevard and 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue observed an expired license plate displayed on a vehicle that was traveling directly in front of the Officer. A traffic stop was conducted, at which time it was discovered that the operator of the vehicle was Driving Under Suspension. The driver was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(November 21: Monday)

Unknown person(s) entered into an unsecured vehicle, which was parked in the drive of a rental residence. The victim reported that there were several pieces of expensive jewelry, some electronics and several bottles of prescription medication stolen.

While conducting route patrol on the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. After confirming a speeding violation, the Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. It was learned that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a valid driver's license. Consequently, the driver was charged with Driving Under Suspension.

(November 22: Tuesday)

The Isle of Palms Police Department Dispatch Center received a call from a victim who stated that an unknown subject had pointed and presented a firearm at him as a result of an incident of road rage. The perpetrator was located and charged accordingly.

While speaking with a subject in reference to the possible theft of items from his vehicle, a local and national database inquiry produced information that the subject had an outstanding warrant out of the Bonneau Police Department (BPD). The subject was placed under arrest and released to the BPD.

(November 23: Wednesday)

Officers met with victims at their second residence, which is also a rental property. The victims reported that several screens had been removed from the windows and a number of other screens had been cut. However, it did not appear that entry was made into the residence. The property manager stated that the last renters may be responsible for the damage.

(November 25: Friday)

A victim reported that she had been sexually assaulted by a co-worker several days prior to making the report. The case was assigned to an Investigator and it was determined that the encounter was consensual.

(November 27: Sunday)

While in the area of Palm Boulevard and 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue, an Officer observed a vehicle being operated by an individual that was not wearing his seatbelt. After conducting a lawful traffic stop on the vehicle, information obtained by the Officer confirmed that the operator did not have a valid driver's license. Consequently, the subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(November 28: Monday)

At approximately 12:15 a. m., Officers observed a white female operating a golf cart on Ocean Boulevard, in the Front Beach area. When Officers made contact with the subject to advise her that it is unlawful to operate a golf cart at night, they found the driver to be intoxicated. The subject was placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence.

Officers were dispatched to the 400 block of Ocean Boulevard in reference to a suspicious vehicle/person. The vehicle was located, at which time Officers conducted a traffic stop on the same. Officers obtained identification information for the three occupants of the vehicle for positive identification. Information was received that one of the passengers had an outstanding bench warrant for Failure to Pay a Traffic Fine.

(November 29: Tuesday)

An Officer was approached by a white male at the Kangaroo Express, requesting directions. Shortly thereafter, Dispatch received a complaint from an individual in reference to a suspicious person/vehicle in the area of 45th Avenue. The same Officer that provided directions to the white male determined that the description of the suspicious person/vehicle reported on 45th Avenue was similar to the description of the subject he had spoken with at the Kangaroo Express earlier. Officers located the vehicle traveling southbound in the 3000 block of Palm Boulevard and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. While speaking with the subject he continuously placed his hands in his front pants pocket, despite being advised, on numerous

occasions to keep his hands visible. Consequently, Officers conducted a search of the subject for Officer safety. A handgun was located in the subject's pants pocket. A search of local and national crime databases produced information that the handgun was legal and the subject was not wanted, and held a valid concealed weapons permit. The subject was released. Later on the same date, the West Virginia State Police (WVSP) contacted Dispatch and requested to speak with the Officer that had encountered the white male subject. After the Officer provided a brief synopsis of the incidents that had occurred on the Isle of Palms, the WVSP advised that they were in the process of entering an active warrant into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) database for the subject with the charge of Terrorist Activity. This information was relayed to Isle of Palms Police Department (IOPPD) Officers, all of whom began a search for the subject. At approximately 12:11 pm, the suspect vehicle was located and was being operated by the same subject. A felony traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle on Ocean Boulevard, in front of the Seaside Inn. At the time of the traffic stop, the spouse of the subject was also occupying the vehicle. Both subjects were detained and armed with handguns at the time of the traffic stop. A search of the vehicle produced a quantity of additional firearms, ammunition and additional items of suspicion. The local Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) division was notified and responded to assist IOPPD Officers and Investigators with determining the legality of the seized firearms. Efforts have been coordinated with IOPPD, ATF-Charleston Field Office, the WVSP, ATF-West Virginia and Federal Prosecutors. After satisfying IOPPD charges, the subject will be extradited to West Virginia for Federal prosecution.

(November 30: Wednesday)

While conducting route patrol in the area of 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue and Wildwood, an Officer observed the operator of a vehicle disregard the stop sign at the aforementioned intersection. After conducting a traffic stop upon the vehicle, the operator was placed under arrest for Driving Under Suspension.

### Patrol

During the month of November, 2011, Officers issued 19 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 10 Victim of Crime forms completed.

Officers/Investigators conducted three Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) surveys. Two were residential with the third being for a local business.


