Date: May 1, 2013

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April, 2013.

(April 2: Tuesday)

Narcotics Violation Arrest: An Officer conducting patrol in the 1300 block of Ocean Boulevard observed a suspicious vehicle and stopped to investigate. The vehicle was occupied by two individuals found to be engaged in indecent activity. Upon identifying the occupants, information was provided to the Officers that one of the subjects had a failure to pay a traffic fine bench warrant. The subject was taken into custody. A pre-tow inventory of the vehicle produced a quantity of a green, plant-like material that field-tested presumptive positive for tetrahydrocannabinol (THC, the active ingredient found in marijuana). The subjects were charged accordingly.

Intimidation: Investigators conducted a follow-up investigation regarding threatening emails the victim reported having received sporadically over several years. According to the victim, as of late, the threats have become more severe. Through investigation, it was determined that the sender resides out of state. Consequently, Investigators contacted and turned the case over to the local Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) field office.

(April 3: Wednesday)

Breach of Trust: The victim reported that she provided her credit card to an acquaintance to purchase a bottle of vodka. Shortly thereafter, the victim learned that the same subject withdrew \$200.00 from a local ATM, without her consent or knowledge. Warrants were obtained for the subject, who was eventually located and arrested.

(April 4: Thursday)

Traffic Offense Arrest: An Officer conducting patrol in the 2100 block of Palm Boulevard observed a vehicle fail to stop at a stop sign as it exited the Beachside Community area. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator did not possess a driver's license.

(April 5: Friday)

Financial Transaction Card Fraud: The victim reported that he had received notification from his financial institution regarding a series of suspicious cash advance withdrawals on his Visa credit card, totaling approximately \$3,400.00. The victim confirmed that he had not made the withdrawals and had never lost possession of his credit card. The case is being investigated by the Criminal Investigations Division.

(April 6: Saturday)

Petit Larceny: A victim reported that he had placed his briefcase on the ground, near his vehicle, while loading luggage and that he left it unattended for a short amount of time while he retrieved additional luggage from their condominium. Upon his return to the vehicle, he discovered that the briefcase which contained a number of electronic items, including an Apple laptop computer and iPhone, and his wallet had been stolen. The victim was able to provide the make, model and serial number for both the laptop and phone, which were entered as stolen in the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) database. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

Traffic Offense/Warrant Arrest: An Officer was dispatched to the 2100 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a hit and run collision. The complainant was able to provide a detailed description of the suspect vehicle, as well as the operator. An assisting Officer located the suspect vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Through investigation, the Officer received information that the operator's driver's license was suspended and that he had an outstanding arrest warrant with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The operator was placed under arrest and charged with Failure to Stop and Render Aid, as well as a second offense of driving under suspension.

(April 8: Monday)

Petit Larceny: The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bicycle from within her unsecured garage while she was inside her residence.

(April 9: Tuesday)

Warrant Arrest/Other Law Enforcement Agency Assist: The Mount Pleasant Police Department requested an Officer meet with them on 44th Avenue to assist in taking a subject into custody in reference to active arrest warrants from their agency. The subject was located and detained without incident.

(April 10: Wednesday)

Narcotics/Alcohol Violations Arrest: An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a speeding violation. While speaking with the operator of the vehicle, the Officer observed a strong smell of an alcoholic beverage and burnt marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. Additionally, the Officer observed in plain view, a glass pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana, as well as a bottle of liquor with a broken seal. All four occupants of the vehicle were detained. A pre-tow inventory of the vehicle produced a quantity of a green, plant-like material which field-tested presumptive positive for tetrahydrocannabinol (THC, the active ingredient found in marijuana) and a styrofoam cup containing an alcoholic beverage. The four subjects were charged accordingly.

Financial Transaction Card Fraud: The victim reported that unknown person(s) utilized her personal information to obtain a credit card. The subject attempted to make a \$7,900.00 purchase on the fraudulent card.

Breach of Trust: The victim reported that she had hired a live-in female to house watch her residence for her, as she is frequently out of town. After the employee was arrested by the Mount Pleasant Police Department for larceny, she took inventory of her valuable items and discovered several pieces of jewelry missing. The case is being investigated by the Criminal Investigations Division.

(April 13: Saturday)

Disorderly Conduct/Alcohol Violation: While conducting patrol in the vicinity of 14th Avenue and Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed a subject staggering about the intersection. Upon making contact with the subject, it was established that the subject was grossly intoxicated. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(April 14: Sunday)

Traffic Offense Arrest: An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. The Officer received information that the operator's driver's license was suspended.

(April 15: Monday)

Motor Vehicle Theft: While patrolling the area of 10th Avenue and Carolina Boulevard, an Officer located a Club-Cart golf-cart obstructing a lane travel, unoccupied with the keys in the ignition. The victim was eventually located and advised the Officer that person(s) unknown stole the golf cart from under his garage during the night.

Traffic Offense Arrest: An Officer patrolling the area of 41st Avenue and Wildwood Drive observed a vehicle bearing an expired license plate decal. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator did not possess a driver's license.

(April 17: Wednesday)

Disturbance/Warrant Arrest:

Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard in reference to a verbal altercation between a male and female. Upon locating and making contact with the subjects, both of whom were intoxicated, information was obtained indicating the female had three outstanding bench warrants for failure to pay traffic tickets, as well as an arrest warrant out of the Summerville Police Department.

(April 18: Thursday)

Burglary: The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered her residence, through an unsecured rear window and stole her jewelry and a musical instrument. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(April 20: Saturday)

Narcotics Violation Arrest: Officers responded to the Isle of Palms Connector to assist a stranded motorist. A check of the license plate through the Department of Motor Vehicles returned information that the plate was suspended for failure to maintain insurance. Additionally, information was obtained that indicated that the operator's driver's license was also suspended. The subject was placed under arrest and a pre-tow inventory was conducted on the vehicle; during which a time a quantity of a green, plant-like material which field-tested presumptive positive for tetrahydrocannabinol (THC, the active ingredient in marijuana) was located. The subject was charged accordingly.

(April 21: Sunday)

Traffic Offense Arrest: An Officer patrolling the area of Waterway Boulevard and 41st Avenue observed a vehicle traveling at a rate of speed greater than the posted 25 mph. After confirming the violation, the Officer conducted a traffic stop and in speaking with the operator, and through information received from telecommunications, it was learned that the operator's driver's license was suspended. The operator was charged with driving under suspension, operating an uninsured motor vehicle and failure to register vehicle.

Driving Under The Influence/Narcotics Violation: While in the 800 block of Palm Boulevard, and after observing a number of traffic infractions (suspicion of DUI and collecting tracking evidence) an Officer conducted a traffic stop on the suspect vehicle. After failing to successfully perform a series of Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks (SFSTs) and refusing to provide a breath sample via Data Master; the subject was placed under arrest and charged with DUI. He was also charged with possession of drug paraphernalia as a result of discovery of a glass pipe, commonly utilized for smoking marijuana, was located within his vehicle during the pre-tow inventory.

(April 23: Tuesday)

Financial Transaction Card Fraud: The victim reported that an acquaintance used her Target credit card, to make fraudulent purchases, without her consent.

(April 24: Wednesday)

Criminal Domestic Violence: The victim reported to Officers that during an argument with her husband, he shoved her against a wall injuring her head, neck, arm, and hand.

Theft From Motor Vehicle: The victim advised a possible known suspect entered into her unsecured vehicle and stole a pair of boots.

(April 27: Saturday)

Traffic Offense Arrest: An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle in the 1400 block of Palm Boulevard, after observing an equipment violation. As a result, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a driver's license.

(April 28: Sunday)

Traffic Offense Arrest: After conducting a traffic stop for a speeding violation, it was learned that the operator's driver's license was suspended.

(April 29: Monday)

Burglary: The victim reported that a possible known subject entered into his residence and took, and carried away without his consent, an Apple iPad. The victim was able to provide model and serial number for the stolen item, which was entered into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) database. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

Burglary: The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her residence and stole a significant number of jewelry pieces. There were no indications that forced entry was made into the residence. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

Petit Larceny: The victim reported that unknown person(s) removed a yard decoration without her consent.

Traffic Offense Arrest: An Officer conducting traffic enforcement on 41st Avenue conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle after observing, and confirming, a speeding violation. Through investigation, it was determined that both the operator's driver's license and vehicle license plate were suspended for insurance reasons. The subject was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(April 30: Tuesday)

Traffic Offense Arrest: While patrolling in the 3200 block of Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed a seatbelt violation. The Officer turned around to position behind the vehicle to conduct a traffic stop, at which time the Officer witnessed several additional violations to include a significant increase in the traveling rate of speed, as to give the appearance of eluding the Officer. After the vehicle came to a stop,

both the operator and passenger exited the vehicle. The Officer provided commands for the subjects to get back into the vehicle, to which they complied. The operator advised the Officer that he did not have his driver's license with him. Both the operator and passenger provided wrong information to the Officer; however, after positive identification was made on both subjects, it was determined that the operator had an outstanding warrant out of the Orangeburg County Sheriff's Office. The passenger also had an active bench warrant out of the Charleston Police Department. Both subjects were detained without further incident.

Patrol

During the month of April 2013, Officers issued six (6) Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were seven (7) Victim of Crime forms completed.

Community Service/Crime Prevention

(PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM)

During the month of April, police department personnel continued assisting rental agencies with tagging electronic equipment inside rental properties. The information is being entered into a database maintained by the department.

(NEIGHBORHOOD MEET & GREET PROGRAM)

The Meet & Greet meeting that was scheduled for April 25th (5-6 p. m.) was rescheduled due to inclement weather. The reschedule date is set for May 9th (5-6 p. m.).
