The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of June.

## Wednesday, June 1

### Petit Larceny – 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Beach

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his beach bag containing his wallet, cell phone and other items, which he left on the beach unattended while he was swimming. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$530. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Petit Larceny – 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Beach

Two victims reported that unknown person(s) stole two iPhones and other personal items, which had been left on the beach unattended while they were swimming. The officer was able to locate a witness and obtain descriptions of three possible suspects. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigations.

## Saturday, June 4

### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game – 1400 Block Palm Boulevard

A local rental company reported that a subject had rented a property and had an outstanding bill. The victim attempted to process payment, which was returned for insufficient funds and the credit card on file was declined. The approximate amount that the victim has as a loss is \$11,706. It has been determined that this suspect was involved in two similar cases from last month. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Stolen Property Offenses – Palm Boulevard / 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue

An officer observed a suspicious vehicle driving inside Wild Dunes without a proper pass on the driver's side front dash / windshield area. As the vehicle passed by another officer, it was observed to have an equipment violation. The officers conducted a traffic stop and upon making contact with the occupants, could smell marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. While speaking with the occupants, the officer observed an ammunition magazine in the open center console and all subjects were detained. Officers located a loaded handgun under the front passenger seat and a rifle sticking through the trunk into the back seat. As officers conducted a search of the vehicle, they found several electronic items, women's purses and other items. Contact was made with a local agency, who confirmed that they had several car

break-ins. The officer was able to determine that some of the items in the suspect vehicle were stolen. The occupants were arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Credit Card Fraud – 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had obtained the information from her debit card and made several unauthorized purchases in the local area. The officer made contact with the local stores where the information was used to obtain video or photographs of the suspect(s). The approximate amount unlawfully charged is \$1,586. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Tuesday, June 7

##### Petit Larceny – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) went aboard his docked boat and stole an assortment of fishing equipment. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$315. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Wednesday, June 8

##### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 71 MPH in a 55 MPH speed zone. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked, she stated that she had been drinking. The officer asked the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. At the conclusion of the testing, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample with a BAC of .15%. The driver was transported and lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Thursday, June 9

##### Petit Larceny – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) went aboard his boat and stole a yeti cooler. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$350. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Friday, June 10

##### Burglary – 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into the garage area of the house he where he was staying and stole his motorcycle. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$2,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

##### Grand Larceny – Morgan Place Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a special robotic welding machine. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$8,000. This case has been assigned to CID, who was able to determine that the welding machine had been pawned at a local pawnshop. Investigation continues.

**Burglary – 800 Block Ocean Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into the garage area of the house where he was staying and stole his mountain bicycle. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$900. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Theft from Motor Vehicle – Beach Access / 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her beach bag containing several items, including her car keys, while she was swimming. The unknown person(s) then located her parked vehicle and stole her wallet from inside the center console. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$645. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Saturday, June 11**

**Theft from Motor Vehicle – 2600 Block Palm Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had taken the car key from her beach bag while she was walking. The suspects then located her vehicle and stole cell phones, cash, identification documents, and other miscellaneous items. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$769. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Warrant Arrest- 2600 Block Palm Boulevard**

An officer who was taking a report for a theft from a motor vehicle determined that the reporting victim had an outstanding arrest warrant with Orangeburg Public Safety Department for Forgery. The warrant and extradition was confirmed. The officer placed the subject under arrest and transported her to the AI Cannon Detention Center where a hold was placed until Orangeburg Public Safety Department could arrange for extradition.

**Sunday, June 12**

**Vandalism- Grand Pavilion Area**

An officer responded to a report of vandalism in progress. Upon arrival, he made contact with the complainant, who reported that a male subject, who was intoxicated had punched a hole in the television and threw the patio furniture off the balcony into the swimming pool below. The subject was arrested and lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

**Drug Violation/Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector**

An officer stopped a vehicle for moving violations and in the process of stopping the vehicle observed one of the occupants throw a beverage out of the passenger side window. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer was able to smell the odor of marijuana coming from within the vehicle. The officer requested the driver to do Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. The driver refused to complete the tests and was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI. The driver was transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center for a Datamaster Test, where the driver provided a breath sample with a BAC of .25%. Further investigation revealed that the passenger was in possession of cocaine and marijuana. Both subjects were lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

**Monday, June 13**

**Underage Possession of Alcohol**- 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue

Officers responded to a noise violation complaint of loud music and people yelling. Officers went to the swimming pool area and found a large quantity of beer bottles and subjects under the age of twenty-one. The underage subjects became belligerent and rude when asked to wake up the parents at the rental property. They refused and were placed under arrest. The subject responsible for renting the home was located and explained that he did not know the male subjects swimming in the pool. The subject was issued a citation for the noise violation. The two underage subjects were lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Credit Card Fraud**-1300 Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a subject rented a home and that a portion of the balance had not been paid and the credit card was reported as inactivated. The officer went to the rental property and spoke with the subjects, who indicated that there must be some type of mistake, providing vague information. The victim stated that if they could not pay for the balance, they would need to leave. The subjects began packing up their belongings. The approximate amount that was not paid is \$2,931. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation. Further investigation revealed additional credit card fraud to the level that this case was turned over to the U.S. Secret Service.

**Breach of Trust** – 3000 Block of Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that she had allowed her stepson to borrow her bicycle to attend a meeting. The stepson failed to return the bicycle when confronted, admitted to pawning it. CID was able to locate the bicycle at a local pawnshop and identified other items belonging to the victim. The approximate value of the items is \$100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Petit Larceny** – Beach / County Park

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bag from the beach while she was swimming. The bag contained a cell phone, which was stolen. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Petit Larceny** – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his yeti cooler from his docked boat. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Friday, June 17**

**Theft from Motor Vehicle** – 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her vehicle that had been parked while she was walking on the beach and stole her cell phone and wallet. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$720. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Monday, June 20**

**Warrant Arrest** – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for driving below the posted speed limit of 55 MPH and impeding traffic. Upon contact with the occupants of the vehicle, it was determined that the driver had a suspended driver's license and the passenger had three outstanding arrest warrants with Charleston County

Sheriff's Office for Failure to Appear. The passenger was arrested and lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Wednesday, June 22**

**Motor Vehicle Theft – Palm Boulevard / 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole the rental vehicle he had parked at the beach access. The vehicle was entered into NCIC after obtaining information from the rental company. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$25,300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Friday, June 24**

**Burglary – 3300 Block Cameron Boulevard**

The property manager for a rental property reported that unknown person(s) broke into the residence and stole furniture, beds, televisions and appliances. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$9,675. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Saturday, June 25**

**Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector**

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 79 MPH in a 55 MPH posted speed zone. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. The officer asked the driver to do Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. At the conclusion of testing, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample with a BAC of .11%. The driver was lodged at the Detention Center.

**Sunday, June 26**

**Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard**

An officer responded to a report of a subject passed out behind the wheel of a running car. The officer located the vehicle and attempted to wake him up. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted to consuming two shots and two liquor drinks. The officer requested the driver to do Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. At the conclusion, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster Testing where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .11%. The driver was lodged.

**Driving Under the Influence- 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard**

An officer responded to a report of a drunk driver on the IOP Connector. The officer located the vehicle and stopped the vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer requested the driver to do Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. At the completion of testing, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .14%. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## **Monday, June 27**

### **Petit Larceny – 3600 Block Waterway Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen her unique, personalized bicycle from her residence. While the victim was in Goose Creek, she observed an unknown subject riding her bicycle and contacted the Goose Creek Police Department. The subject admitted to taking the bicycle. The case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Beach Alcohol Enforcement**

During the month, Officers patrolled the beach and charged ten (10) persons for violating the City's ordinance preventing alcohol on the beach.
