

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for January 11 - 17, 2010**

Case Synopsis

CRIMINAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. Cameron Boulevard. 01/17/2010. Officers responded to the incident location after receiving a call, via 911, from a male subject stating that his wife was grossly intoxicated, had assaulted him and was refusing to allow him to leave the residence to avoid further assault. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the male subject who further reported that his wife arrived home, on this date, at which time a verbal altercation began between him and his wife because she wrecked her vehicle in West Ashley due to her intoxicated state. According to the victim, his wife was able to get the wrecked vehicle out of a ditch and drive the same to their home on the Isle of Palms. During the verbal altercation, according to the victim, his wife became belligerent and began striking him about the head and facial region with closed fists. Physical manifestations of injury to the victim were consistent with his account of the incident. While speaking with the suspect, officers detected a strong smell of alcoholic beverage emitting from her person and observed blood on the knuckles of both her hands. There were no other injuries observed on the suspect. After making the determination that the suspect was the primary aggressor in the physical assault, she was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT. Hartnett Boulevard. 01/14/2010. Witnesses/complainants arrived at the incident location for a visit (from Texas) and found their daughter unconscious and bearing physical manifestations of injury. Officers arrived on scene and requested Isle of Palms Fire Department (IOPFD) First Responders and Charleston County Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Upon regaining consciousness, the victim advised officers that she did not know who had beaten her up. Investigators were notified and responded to the residence to process the crime scene. The victim was transported to East Cooper Regional Medical Center for further assessment. The Victim Advocate responded to the hospital to meet with the victim and her parents. The investigation continues.

DOMESTIC DISPUTE/SIMPLE ASSAULT. Palmetto Drive. 01/14/2010. The victim reported to officers that his stepson had returned to the rental unit from playing golf grossly intoxicated. Shortly thereafter, while having dinner, a verbal altercation began between the victim and suspect, at which time the suspect struck the victim about his head and facial region with closed fists. The suspect was detained and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.
