

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for March 1-7, 2010**

Case Synopsis

ACCIDENT (FATALITY). Ocean Boulevard. 03/01/10. Officers responded to the Sea Cabins in reference to an auto collision where a 1994 Chevrolet S10 pickup struck building A. The vehicle was occupied by a white male and a white female; both appeared to have sustained head and neck injury. Upon speaking with the driver, he advised Officers that his brakes had failed as he was traveling in-bound on the Connector. As a result, he struck a curb at the intersection of 14th Avenue and Palm Boulevard, hit a palm tree, and continued traveling east on 14th Avenue, where the vehicle came to a stop after striking the southwest corner of building A. Both occupants were transported to MUSC by the Charleston County Emergency Medical Services. On 03/05/10, an officer made contact with the male driver to deliver documents regarding the incident and was provided information that the female passenger was deceased, as of early morning 03/05/10, while still in the care of MUSC. According to the Charleston County Coroner's Office, the death of the passenger was directly related to the injuries she had sustained during the injury.

BURGLARY. Ocean Boulevard. 03/01/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) had entered the garage area of the residence and took and carried away a 100 foot roll of 12 inch copper. There were no indications of forced entry into the compromised area. The investigation continues.

MALICIOUS INJURY TO PROPERTY. 41st Avenue. 03/01/10. Officers responded to the incident location, which is the secondary home of the victim. The victim reported observing damage to a window on the rear of the residence and what appeared to be remnants of paint, from a paintball gun, on an exterior shed. The investigation continues.
