Weekly Crime Report for March 15 - 21, 2010

Case Synopsis

VANDALISM. Oceanside Villas. 03/21/10. Victim reported to officers that unknown person(s) vandalized his vehicle by scratching the paint finish with an unknown object. Officers interviewed neighbors, one of which observed a white, male subject commit the transgression. Officers obtained a description of the suspect and began a search of the area, locating the suspect and his father. The suspect's father inquired of his son whether or not he had damaged the victim's vehicle, to which the suspect stated "no". The suspect's father advised officers that his son was mentally handicapped and through observations of his son's behavior during his inquiry, did not believe his son. Witnesses positively identified the aforementioned subject as the perpetrator. The victim stated that he did not wish to pursue charges if the suspect's father agreed to pay for repair of the damages, to which the suspect's father agreed.

LARCENY (THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE). J. C. Long Boulevard. 03/20/10. Victim reported that he had left his vehicle parked overnight in front of Island Times. Upon his return the next morning, he discovered that unknown person(s) had unlawfully entered his locked truck and took and carried away his Rolex watch. Investigators checked the pawn system for the watch with negative results. The victim was able to provide the serial number for the watch, which was subsequently entered into the National Crime Information Center database. The investigation continues.

VANDALISM. 45th Avenue. 03/18/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) vandalized his vehicle by scratching the paint and damaging the finish with an unknown object. No leads nor suspects have developed at this time.

FRAUD/IDENTITY THEFT. Sparrow Drive. 03/16/10. Victim reported to investigators that unknown person(s) attempted an electronic wire transfer of \$2,000 from her checking account via the internet. The fraudulent activity appears to have originated from an unknown specific location in Turkey. The investigation continues.
