

Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for April 26 – May 2, 2010

Case Synopsis

GRAND LARCENY. Palm Boulevard. 04/28/10. Victim reported to officers that unknown person(s) took and carried away his boat trailer without his permission. There are no suspects at this time. The stolen property was entered into the National Crime Information Center Database.

FORCIBLE RAPE. Forest Trail. 04/28/10. Victim reported that approximately nine months and two weeks prior to report date, she had met the suspect on the internet, via My Space. After communicating, via My Space, for a couple of days she agreed to go on a date with the suspect. The victim alleges that while on the first date, she believes the suspect contaminated her drink with an unknown narcotic which caused her to "go to sleep". The victim and suspect went on a second date, and stopped communicating shortly thereafter. The victim reported that the suspect had to have had intercourse with her, without her knowledge or consent, on the first date, as she gave birth to a child she believes to be the result of criminal sexual conduct. The investigation continues.

BURGLARY. Palm Boulevard. 04/26/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) forcefully entered his residence and stole a flat panel television, after cutting telephone cords and forcefully removing the electrical box from an exterior wall. The investigation continues.

BURGLARY. Ocean Boulevard. 04/26/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the residence through what she believed to be an unsecured rear door. After making entry, unknown suspect(s) took and carried away a flat panel television. The investigation continues.

BURGLARY. Palm Boulevard. 04/26/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) had entered the residence through a damaged door and stole three (3) flat panel televisions, a DVD player and a CD stereo system. The investigation continues.

INTIMIDATION. Cameron Boulevard. 04/30/10. On report date, victim contacted the police department to report that she had been speaking with her ex-husband on the telephone, at which time he threatened to shoot her and their two children. At the time of the complaint, the victim was en route to the Isle of Palms from Rock Hill, South Carolina. Officers responded to the scene and took emergency protective custody of the two juvenile children and transported the ex-husband to the Medical University of South Carolina for a psychological evaluation.
