

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for June 7 - 13, 2010**

Case Synopsis

GRAND LARCENY/FRAUD/SWINDLE. 57th Avenue. 06/07/10. The victim reported that she had received a telephone call from a male subject stating that he was an attorney in New York and was calling on behalf of the victims' grandson, who had allegedly been involved in an auto collision. According to the victim, the male subject stated that she needed to wire \$3,000 to the victim of the auto collision, of which her grandson was at fault. The victim did wire \$3,000 to a Western Union in Spain. Shortly thereafter, the victim received another telephone call from the male subject requesting an additional \$3,000, to compensate for the difference between U. S. currency and the euro. The victim wired the additional \$3,000 to the same Western Union in Spain. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

BURGLARY. Palm Boulevard. 06/07/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) forcefully entered his residence and took and carried away approximately \$1,500 worth of personal property. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

BURGLARY. Ocean Boulevard. 06/08/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the enclosed garage of his residence and took and carried away a bicycle without his consent or knowledge. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

NARCOTICS ARREST (TRAFFICKING/POSSESSION WITH THE INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE). Ocean Boulevard. 06/10/10. Officers approached a male subject who appeared to be urinating in public. Upon approach, the subject tossed a clear plastic baggie containing a number of smaller baggies containing cocaine. After tossing the bag to the ground, the subject attempted to flee the scene. Officers were able to catch and detain the subject. After being placed under arrest, officers located additional narcotics (marijuana, Ecstasy, and ketamine ["Special K"]). The quantities were substantial enough to constitute trafficking and possession with the intent to distribute charges.

ATTEMPTED MURDER. Pavillion Drive. 06/12/10. Officers were dispatched to a fight in progress at the municipal parking lot. Upon arrival, the suspect was fleeing the scene, however, was apprehended. The victim was located and found to have multiple lacerations about his head and facial region. Witnesses provided statements to officers that after a verbal altercation ensued between the suspect and victim, the suspect retrieved a baseball bat from within his vehicle and continuously struck the victim about the head and facial region; causing great bodily harm. The victim was transported to the Medical University of South Carolina via Charleston County EMS. Due to the suspects malice aforethought (given the location and nature of the victims' injuries), he was placed under arrest and charged with attempted murder. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division for follow-up investigation.

GRAND LARCENY. Palmetto Drive. Victim reported that her jewelry was stolen from her residence by unknown person(s). The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.
