

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for June 21 – 27, 2010**

Case Synopsis

FRAUD. Ocean Boulevard. 6/21/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) utilized her credit card number to make fraudulent purchases totaling approximately \$3,500 at various businesses located in Massachusetts.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE/FRAUD. Sea Cabins. 06/21/10. Victim reported that suspects unknown broke one of the windows out of her vehicle and took her purse, thereafter, utilized her credit cards to make fraudulent purchases as several Exxons in the Charleston area.

VANDALISM/DISORDERLY CONDUCT/MINOR IN POSSESSION ALCOHOL. 06/22/10. Officers on patrol observed two white male juvenile subjects vandalizing mailboxes in the 100, 200 and 300 blocks of Ocean Boulevard. After a foot pursuit, both subjects were detained and charged accordingly.

FRAUD. Fairway Village Lane. 06/22/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) utilized her credit card number to make a fraudulent purchase for approximately \$60.00. It appears the perpetrator of the fraudulent activity lives in California.

SIMPLE ASSAULT. Citadel Beach House. 06/24/10. A verbal altercation between two white male subjects escalated to a physical altercation. The verbal altercation began when the victim advised the perpetrator that his children were destroying the restrooms.

PETIT LARCENY. 53rd Avenue. 06/24/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) removed the cover from his boat, and took it without his permission.

BURGLARY/SIMPLE ASSAULT. Ocean Boulevard. 06/24/10. Officers responded to a burglary in progress where two white males broke and entered into the aforementioned residence and assaulted the occupants. The perpetrators stated, to officers, that the occupants of the residence were on the beach earlier in the evening at the same time they were, at which time, the occupants of the residence started throwing cans at them, then departed the beach and went inside their residence. Thereafter, the two suspects entered into the residence and assaulted the same.
