Weekly Crime Report for June 28 – July 4, 2010

Case Synopsis

SIMPLE ASSAULT. Palm Boulevard. 06/28/10. Officers responded to the incident location in reference to an assault between two adult siblings. The victim reported that a verbal altercation escalated to a physical altercation when her brother "head-butted" her across the bridge of her nose. The perpetrator was taken into custody and charged with Assault and Battery, 3rd Degree.

BURGLARY. Linkside Court. 06/29/10. A representative of the rental company responsible for this property reported that unknown person(s) entered the residence and took and carried away a television. There were no indications of forced entry.

PETIT LARCENY. Ocean Boulevard. 07/01/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) took and carried away a pool heater, which had been stored in the garage of the residence.

PETIT LARCENY. County Park. 07/02/10. The victim reported that he had left his camera, unsecured, on the beach while he entered the water. Upon returning, discovered that unknown person(s) had stolen his camera. There were no witnesses to the incident.

HARASSMENT. 29th Avenue. 07/02/10. Victim reported to officers that her ex-boyfriend continuously calls and sends text messages to her, her room-mate and family members, although he has been advised not to contact her. The victim is in the process of obtaining a Restraining Order at this time.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT. Windjammer. 07/04/10. Officers responded to a call regarding a fight in progress. Upon arrival, the victim was located and found to be unconscious. Simultaneously, the perpetrator was located and placed under arrest and charged accordingly. Witnesses stated that the victim and suspect had a verbal altercation in reference to the victim waving a flag in the face of a female acquaintance of the suspect. Shortly thereafter, the suspect struck the victim in the face, with a closed-fist with such force as to render the victim unconscious. The victim was transported to the Medical University of South Carolina for medical treatment and further evaluation.
