

**Isle of Palms Police Department  
Weekly Crime Report for August 9-15, 2010**

Case Synopsis

**PETIT LARCENY.** Palmetto Drive. 08/09/10. The victim reported that a quantity of cash was stolen from her rental unit. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division. As of the date of this report, suspects have developed. The investigation continues.

**PETIT LARCENY.** Pelican Reach Drive. 08/11/10. The victim reported to the police that a quantity of cash was taken and carried away from within their rental unit. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division. Suspects have developed and the investigation continues.

**GRAND LARCENY.** Palmetto Drive. 08/12/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) removed his Prince FP Triathlon bicycle from the bicycle rack attached to his SUV. A serial number was provided to the officer, and the bicycle has been entered into the National Crime Information Center database (NCIC) as stolen property. The bicycle has an approximate value of \$8,000.

**BURGLARY.** Cameron Boulevard. 08/11/10. Officers responded to the rental property in reference to a burglary, where forced entry was made into the residence. An investigator was requested to respond to the scene. The scene was processed for evidence. Two televisions were the only items stolen. The investigation continues.

**GRAND LARCENY.** The Windjammer. 08/12/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) had taken and carried away, without his knowledge or consent, his Paul Reed Smith brand guitar. The property has an approximate value of \$8,000.

**SIMPLE ASSAULT.** 25th Avenue. 08/14/10. Officers responded to the incident location in reference to an assault that had just occurred where both perpetrators were still on scene. Upon arrival, it was determined that a verbal altercation had escalated to a physical assault. Both female subjects were determined to be primary aggressors and both wished to pursue charges on the other. As a result, both subjects were placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.
