

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for August 16 - 22, 2010**

Case Synopsis

CRIMINAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. Forest Trail. 08/16/10. The victim came to the City of Isle of Palms Public Safety Building to report that his wife had assaulted him and, shortly thereafter, locked him out of their residence. Physical manifestations of injury were apparent on the victims' person. Officers responded to the residence for follow-up investigation. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the victim's wife and received a verbal statement from her. During interview, officers observed blood on her clothing from the victim's injuries. The female subject was placed under arrest after evidence indicated that she was the primary aggressor in the incident. There were no physical manifestation of injury on the perpetrator's person, and the condition of the scene corroborated the victim's account of the incident.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE. Carolina Boulevard. 08/16/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unlocked vehicle and took, and carried away, an Apple iPod and a Garmin GPS unit.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE/BURGLARY. 8th Avenue. 08/19/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered both her unsecured garage and vehicle and took, and carried away, two (2) iPods.

THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLE. 41st Avenue. 08/20/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) took, and carried away his 2007 Club Car golf cart from the parking lot located at 41st Avenue. Estimated value of loss: \$3,500. On or about 08/21/10, the golf cart was located on 45th Avenue, with minor damage.

SIMPLE ASSAULT. 31st Avenue. 08/21/10. The Mount Pleasant Police Department (MPPD) contacted Isle of Palms Police Department telecommunications and requested that an Isle of Palms Police Officer meet with them at Nason's Medical Center in reference to an assault that had occurred on the Isle of Palms. Upon arrival, IOPPD officers met with an MPPD officer and the victim (a juvenile), both advising that the juvenile's mother's boyfriend had physically assaulted her by striking her with his hands, as a result of a verbal altercation between the juvenile and her mother. The investigation continues.
