

**Isle of Palms Police Department

Case Synopsis

FORGERY/COUNTERFEITING. Ocean Boulevard. 09/06/10. An officer responded to the County Park in reference to the passing of a possible counterfeited bill. The bill was of U. S. denomination and was collected as evidence.

PETIT LARCENY. Palm Boulevard. 09/06/10. Victim reported that she had left two surfboards, unsecured, on her front porch. Both boards were taken and carried away by unknown person(s).

PETIT LARCENY. Ocean Boulevard. 09/06/10. Victim reported that he left his shorts and wallet unsecured on the beach at which time unknown person(s) took and carried away his property.
