

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for September 20-26, 2010**

Case Synopsis

BURGLARY. Palmetto Drive. 09/20/10. Victim reported to officers that unknown person(s) entered the residence and took, and carried away, a comforter set from one of the bedrooms of the rental residence. There were no indications that forced entry was made into the residence.

BURGLARY. Palm Boulevard. 09/21/10. Victim reported that while upstairs in her residence, she heard a noise downstairs. Upon responding downstairs to investigate, she observed two white males standing in the foyer. The subjects advised the victim that they had an appointment to look at the residence, which is for sale. When the victim advised the subjects that the rental agent had not advised her of any scheduled showings, both left the residence. The victim advised officers that nothing appeared to be missing from the residence.

BURGLARY. Palm Boulevard. 09/22/10. Renters arrived at the residence to find two white males sitting on the back deck of the residence, at which time they also contacted the police department. Contact was eventually made with the homeowner who confirmed that her niece had given two classmates permission to go to the residence.

VANDALISM. Palm Boulevard. 09/23/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) threw a beer bottle through the driver-side window, shattering the same.

DOMESTIC DISPUTE. Beachside Drive. 09/25/10. Complainant advised officers that she and her husband had a verbal altercation during which time the husband, who was intoxicated, stated that he was leaving to go to the airport. The complainant called the police department to stop him from driving. A cab service was contacted and assisted the male subject to the airport safely.

VANDALISM. Waterway Boulevard. 09/26/10. Victim reported to officers that his ex-roommate damaged his camper.

BURGLARY. Fairway Dunes Lane. 09/26/10. Complainant reported that unknown person(s) took and carried away a television from the rental residence. There was no evidence of forced entry into the residence.

CRIMINAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. 09/26/10. The victim reported that she and her husband had a verbal argument on 09/25/10, which escalated into a physical altercation. The victim stated that she was able to leave the residence without any physical manifestation of injuries.
