

Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for October 4 - 10, 2010

Case Synopsis

GRAND LARCENY. Palmetto Drive. 10/04/10. Victim reported that unknown person(s) took and carried away three bicycles during the late evening hours. According to the victim, the bicycles were secured to a bike rack that was attached to his vehicle. The perpetrators cut the lock and removed the bicycles.

SIMPLE ASSAULT. Ocean Boulevard. 10/05/10. Officers were dispatched in reference to a fight in progress; male versus female. Upon arrival, Officers observed a male and female standing in the middle of Ocean Boulevard yelling at each other. The subjects were separated and interviewed. Both stated that the female had slapped the male and attempted to kick him in the groin. The female stated, "he had his tongue down my throat". After the female slapped the male, he pushed her away from him as the female was attempting to kick him in the groin. Neither subject showed any physical manifestation of injury. The female was determined to be the primary aggressor; however, the male subject advised Officers that he did not wish to pursue charges.

DOMESTIC DISPUTE. Cameron Boulevard. 10/06/10. On report date, the police department received a complaint from a neighbor in reference to a domestic dispute. Upon arrival, Officers observed a male and female in a verbal dispute. The subjects were separated and provided the same account of the incident wherein, the verbal dispute began when the female advised the male that she wanted to leave him. Both subjects denied any physical altercation, confirming the Officers' lack of observation of any physical manifestations of injury. The subjects agreed to separate for the remainder of the evening.

PETIT LARCENY. 49th Avenue Beach Access. 10/06/10. Victim reported that she had left her bicycle, unsecured, at the 49th Avenue beach access path while she visited the beach for approximately one hour. Upon return, discovered that unknown person(s) had stolen her bicycle.

PETIT LARCENY. 24th Avenue. 10/07/10. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his yard and took and carried away his bicycle.

FRAUD. Palm Boulevard. 10/08/10. The victim reported that he had received a telephone call from his bank in reference to a possible fraudulent check drawn on his business account. Unknown person(s) presented a counterfeit check for cash in the amount of \$1,106.76.

VANDALISM. Palmetto Drive. 10/08/10. The victim reported that he took his vehicle to the dealership for repair after it failed to start. During a mechanical analysis, it was determined that unknown person(s) had poured a significant amount of water into the gas reservoir.
