

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for October 11 - 17, 2010**

Case Synopsis

VANDALISM. Palm Boulevard. 10/11/10. At approximately 2:45 a.m., Officers were dispatched to Palm Boulevard in reference to a disturbance. The complainant advised that approximately 18-20 white female and male subjects were running northbound on Palm Boulevard yelling and screaming while overturning trashcans. Officers responded to the area indeed finding several trashcans overturned; however, the tops had not been breached and the trash was still contained within. Further, several stop signs had been unearthed and a mailbox had been forcefully removed from its post. The subjects had departed the area, prior to the arrival of Officers.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT(SUSPICIOUS PERSON). 27th Avenue. 10/16/10.

At approximately 7:00 a. m., Officers were dispatched to the incident location in reference to suspicious circumstances/suspicious person. Complainant advised that an unknown white male subject was present on her front porch, continuously banging on her door and yelling "let me in." Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the subject, who was found to be grossly intoxicated. During interview, the subject advised officers that he was visiting from Knoxville, TN and was staying with his friend, whom he thought lived at the incident location. Due to his level of intoxication, the subject was unable to provide the correct address for the individual that he was visiting. He was taken into custody and charged accordingly.

BURGLARY. Palmetto Drive. 10/16/10. The victim (homeowner) reported that unknown person(s) took and carried away various clothing items from within a locked chest of drawers. The residence is a rental property; however, the owner maintains a locked chest of drawers inside an unsecured closet where he stores his personal clothing for their visits.

SUSPICIOUS FIRE. Sand Dunes Lane. 10/17/10. Officers and Fire Fighters were dispatched to the incident location in reference to a fire. Upon arrival, Public Safety personnel observed a wooden planter and the railings on the front porch engulfed in flames. Upon extinguishing the fire, a Fire Department Supervisor requested an Investigator to respond to the scene, in reference to a possible arson. The scene was photographed and processed for potential evidence. The collected evidence is being further analyzed at this time.
