Weekly Crime Report for January 3-9, 2011

Case Synopsis

VANDALISM Report Date: 01/03/11. The victim reported that unknown person(s) vandalized his residence on Forest Trail by breaking three (3) windows and grounding a portion of the fence that surrounds the rear of the property.

BURGLARY Report Date: 01/09/11. Officers met with a victim on Ocean Point Drive in reference to a Burglary. The victim advised Officers that unknown person(s) entered his enclosed, yet unsecured garage. Once therein, the subject(s) entered his unsecured vehicle and took and carried away a quantity of cash. Items from the scene were collected for forensic analysis.

BURGLARY Report Date: 01/09/10. Officers met with a second victim on Ocean Point Drive who reported that unknown person(s) forcefully entered his residence and took and carried away two cellular telephones and a quantity of cash. Items from the scene were collected for forensic analysis.

BREAK & ENTER INTO MOTOR VEHICLE Report Date: 01/09/11. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered her unsecured vehicle, which was parked in the driveway of her residence on Ocean Point Drive. A South Carolina driver's license and a quantity of cash were the only items stolen from within the vehicle.

BREAK & ENTER INTO MOTOR VEHICLE Report Date: 01/09/11. While checking houses and vehicles on Ocean Point Drive, as the result of the aforementioned incidents, Officers located a vehicle on a fourth victim's residence that appeared to have been compromised. The Officers located the victim who confirmed that a quantity of cash had been stolen from within his unsecured vehicle.

Investigators have developed and are pursuing possible leads in the Ocean Point Drive incidents. Further, Investigators are in the process of analyzing and processing evidence recovered from the crime scenes.
