Case Synopsis

**July 11: Monday**

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto his property and stole a flag that was displayed on his front porch.

The victim reported that unknown person(s) broke a glass pane out of a window on the rear of his residence.

The victim reported that her ex-boyfriend continues calling and sending her text messages after he has been advised not to. The case has been assigned to an Investigator for follow-up.

**July 12: Tuesday**

The victim reported that a piece of jewelry had been stolen from her residence. During the time frame of the incident, the victim had several service companies with access to the interior of her residence. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

**July 13: Wednesday**

The manager of a rental property reported that the last long-term renters of the residence removed and took away a number of fixed items from the property. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

**July 15: Friday**

The victim reported that sometime on July 4<sup>th</sup>, an unknown white male juvenile subject stole two bicycles that she had left unsecured while visiting the Grand Pavilion.

**July 16: Saturday**

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his bicycle, which he had left unsecured at the beach access located at Palm Boulevard and 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

**July 17: Sunday**

The victim notified the police department to report that an unknown white male subject was at her residence and was continuously knocking on her front door and windows. Upon arriving on scene, the Officers found the subject to be grossly intoxicated. It was determined that the subject thought he was at his residence, however, due to his level of intoxication was unable to realize that he was not. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.
