Case Synopsis

July 25: Monday

A local business reported that unknown persons took and carried away a low-speed vehicle from the parking lot of the business.

July 27: Wednesday

The victim reported that her son's surfboard was stolen from within her enclosed garage. The victim stated that the garage door was unsecured with the door being left open throughout the evening of the incident date. A suspect has developed, and Investigators are pursuing leads.

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unlocked vehicle and stole his watch, valued at \$2,500. A suspect has developed, and Investigators are pursuing leads.

Officers responded to a residence in reference to an alarm. While on scene, evidence of forced entry into the residence was discovered. Contact was made with the homeowners, whose primary residence is out of state, to advise them of the situation. It was determined that a number of items had been stolen from a storage cabinet located in the garage. A suspect has developed. Arrest warrants are pending.

July 28: Thursday

An Officer on routine patrol of the Front Beach area was flagged down by a subject to report that his vehicle had been stolen. The victim stated that he parked his vehicle in the 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard the night prior and discovered it missing when he returned to retrieve it. The vehicle was entered into the National Crime Information Center database as being stolen. The Police Department was notified by a law enforcement agency in Georgia reporting that the vehicle had been involved in an accident and the occupant hospitalized. The subject has been positively identified and arrest warrants are pending at this time.
