

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for August 15-21, 2011**

Case Synopsis

August 15: Monday

A victim reported that he left his prescription medication in his the rental residence upon checking out. He notified the rental company, who advised him that the medication had been removed from the residence. The case has been assigned to Criminal Investigations.

Officers were dispatched to a rental residence in reference to a physical altercation that had just occurred. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the two female subjects that had been involved in the physical altercation. It was determined that the altercation began when one of the females accused the other of stealing \$40.00 cash from her purse. Neither subject wished to pursue charges, with one of the females agreeing to leave the residence for the remainder of the evening.

August 18: Thursday

Officers were dispatched to the area of 31st Avenue and Cameron Boulevard in reference to a disturbance. The complainant advised that a group of individuals were in the area being loud and yelling at vehicles passing. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with a group of individuals who were consuming alcoholic beverages. The subjects were charged accordingly.

August 19: Friday

The victim reported that an iPod was stolen from within her rental unit. The case has been assigned to Criminal Investigations.

The same victim, as listed above, reported that her wallet was stolen from within the rental property on a separate occasion. There were no signs of forced entry into the rental unit. This case has been assigned to Criminal Investigations.

Officers were dispatched to 19th Avenue in reference to a suspicious person. The complainant advised Officers that a white female knocked on his door, stated she was having trouble with her car, then left the residence. Officers patrolled the area, locating the female. An information check produced an active warrant for the female subject out of the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office. The subject was taken into custody and subsequently released to a Berkeley County Deputy.

August 21: Sunday

A victim reported leaving some personal items unattended on the beach between the Windjammer and public restrooms. Upon returning, the victim discovered that her items had been stolen.

Officers responded to the Exchange Club in reference to a Burglary. The complainant stated that he had gone to the Exchange Club for a meeting and after entering the establishment, discovered a white male inside. The complainant advised Officers that he asked the male subject what he was doing, to which the subject stated that he was looking for a place to sleep then fled the scene. Officers patrolled the area, located the subject and detained the same.
