

Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for August 29 – September 4, 2011

Case Synopsis

August 29: Monday

The victim reported that unknown persons entered into his secondary residence and forced open a briefcase that is normally secured in the owner's closet. A quantity of cash and jewelry was taken from within the brief case. There were no indications of forced entry into the residence or into the locked owner's closet.

August 30: Tuesday

A rental property manager reported that the owner of one of the properties physically assaulted him during a verbal altercation. The victim stated that the homeowner shoved him but he did not wish to pursue charges.

The victim reported a construction trailer and roll of wire stolen from the parking lot of a local business.

A victim reported that she was contacted by her credit card company and advised that unknown person(s) used her credit card number to make fraudulent purchases in Florida.

August 31: Wednesday

Officers were dispatched to the area of J. C. Long Boulevard and Ocean Boulevard in reference to a disturbance being created by an intoxicated white female. The complainant advised that the subject appeared to be grossly intoxicated and was yelling and throwing rocks at vehicles. Officers made contact with the subject who refused to provide any information. She was, subsequently, placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

September 3: Saturday

The victim reported that she and her husband attended an estate sale and, while at the location, laid her iPhone down and realized that she had forgotten to pick it up after she left the residence. Upon returning, the victim was unable to locate her phone. A number of telephone calls were placed using the stolen telephone.

September 4: Sunday

A rental guest reported that a quantity of cash was removed from her wallet, which she had left in her rental unit while visiting the beach.

The victim reported that she had driven to the Isle of Palms to pick up a friend of hers, who was having an argument with her boyfriend. The victim stated that she parked her vehicle on Ocean Boulevard and walked to her friend's location to get her. When she and her friend returned to the victim's vehicle, they discovered that unknown person(s) had vandalized her vehicle by expelling air from one of the tires and puncturing two others.
