

**Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for December 12-18, 2011**

Case Synopsis

December 13: Tuesday

While conducting route patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. After confirming the speed of the vehicle to be in excess of the posted 55 mph speed limit, the Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The operator of the vehicle was unable to produce a valid driver's license upon request. Subsequently, she was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

December 14: Wednesday

An Officer conducting a special patrol request discovered a white male subject at the residence who was not supposed to be there. Through further investigation, it was learned that the subject had failed to pay six traffic fines. The subject was charged accordingly.

December 15: Thursday

Officers were dispatched to an address on 30th Avenue in reference to a possible burglary in progress. The complainant advised that two male subjects appeared to be attempting to force entry into the garage. Prior to the arrival of Officers, the complainant further advised that the subjects had departed the scene in a Nissan Pathfinder. Officers located a vehicle matching the description provided by the complainant and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The complainant positively identified the subjects as the same persons that he had observed attempting to break and enter into a residence in his neighborhood. Through further investigation, it was learned that the subjects were allowed to be at the residence; however, the driver of the vehicle could not produce a valid driver's license. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

December 17: Saturday

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a package that had been delivered to his residence by the U. S. Postal Service and left near his front door.

December 18: Sunday

Officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a possible burglary in progress. The complainant reported that she observed an unknown black male subject exiting her unsecured storage trailer located at the rear of her business. Officers located the subject, who was found to be in possession of property belonging to the victim taken from the storage trailer. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.
