

Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for January 30 – February 5, 2012

Case Synopsis

January 31: Tuesday

While conducting routine patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an officer observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a higher rate of speed than the posted 55 mph. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle and during interview with the operator of the vehicle, it was determined that his driver's license was suspended for failure to pay a traffic fine. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her golf cart from the parking lot of Dewee's Island Marina.

February 1: Wednesday

An officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a speeding violation in the area of Breach Inlet. After positively identifying the driver, information was obtained from the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) that the driver had an outstanding warrant through the Richland County Sheriff's Office for check fraud. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility for extradition.

The property manager of Port O' Call met with an officer in reference to vandalism. Unknown person(s) had cut the screens to a patio door of a unit in the A building. While investigating the scene, officers found the patio door leading into the residence to be unsecure. Officers made entry into the unit to further investigate. No one was inside the residence, nor did it appear that anything was taken from the residence. While on scene, officers located a second residence in the F building with the screens cut and an unsecured door. Again, officers made entry into the residence to ensure that no one was inside. Nothing appeared to have been disturbed.

February 2: Thursday

Officers met with a complainant at Island Laundry in reference to a larceny. Surveillance video from the business shows a white male and a white female stealing two washing machines from the rear of the business.
