

**Isle of Palms Police Department  
Weekly Crime Report for February 13-19, 2012**

Case Synopsis

**February 14: Tuesday**

While traveling along the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed an equipment violation on the vehicle that was traveling in front of the Officer. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined the operator did not have a valid driver's license. The subject was charged accordingly.

**February 15: Wednesday**

An Officer conducting routine patrol in the area of J. C. Long Boulevard and Pavilion Drive observed a vehicle being operated in a reckless and careless manner. After conducting a traffic stop, it was determined that the operator was driving under the influence. The subject was charged accordingly.

**February 17: Friday**

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for non-functioning tail-lamps. Information was attained that the driver had an outstanding warrant from Massachusetts for carrying a prohibited weapon with violent tendencies. However, extradition was denied. The subject was released with a warning for the equipment violation.

**February 18: Saturday**

An Officer was conducting foot patrol of the Front Beach area, during which time a vehicle was observed traveling down the wrong lane of Ocean Boulevard near the Windjammer. When the Officer made contact with the driver, it was ascertained that he was operating the vehicle under the influence of alcohol. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

Officers responded to an address on Cameron Boulevard in reference to a domestic dispute in progress. Upon arrival, Officers met with the male subject who stated that his wife came home from work intoxicated and was very belligerent. According to the complainant, his wife continued yelling and throwing things about the house, in spite of his efforts to calm her. It was recommended that the parties separate for the evening. A taxi-cab service responded to the residence and transported the female to her mother's residence for the rest of the evening.
