

Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for April 30 – May 6, 2012

Case Synopsis

April 30: Monday

The Isle of Palms Fire Department had responded to an address on Waterway Boulevard in reference to a welfare check. Officers also responded to the address, as earlier in the month, the Greenville County Sheriff's Office requested that Isle of Palms Police Department dispatch an Officer to the same address to ascertain as to whether or not an individual for whom they had an active warrant was staying at the address. At that time, Officers were unsuccessful in making contact with the subject. During this incident, Officers positively identified the subject that had the outstanding warrant and arrested the same. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Facility to await extradition.

May 2: Wednesday

Officers were dispatched to the beach access at Palm Boulevard and 21st Avenue in reference to an intoxicated subject that entered into his vehicle on the driver side, as if he were about to drive away from the scene. While speaking with the subject, the Officer detected a strong smell of alcoholic beverage about his person, and the Officer observed that the subject's faculties were appreciably impaired. During conversation, the subject advised that he was not going to drive and that he was waiting for his friend who was going to drive them to their hotel in West Ashley. Shortly thereafter, another subject approached the vehicle, also intoxicated, and admitted that he was the one that was going to drive the vehicle to West Ashley. Both were placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Facility for Disorderly Conduct.

May 3: Thursday

The victim reported that when she returned home from work, she observed a grease-type substance smeared all over the interior walls of her 2nd Avenue residence. The victim advised responding Officers that she and her roommate has had a number of verbal altercations recently, and the roommate is the only person that has access to the residence. There were no indications of forced entry. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

May 4: Friday

Officers were dispatched to a residence on 31st Avenue in reference to a burglary. Upon arrival, Officers met with the victims who reported that they had left the residence 7 days prior for vacation. When they returned home, they observed a number of items, predominantly jewelry, missing. According to one of the victims, the housekeeper had been in the residence the day prior and did not notice anything out of place. The door leading into the residence from the garage was found to be unsecured. There were no indications of forced entry. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

May 5: Saturday

An Officer was dispatched to a residence on 30th Avenue in reference to a vandalism. The victim reported that unknown person(s) had “egged” the rear exterior walls of his residence.
