Case Synopsis

July 02: Monday

Theft From Vehicle: 32nd Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect/s stole her book bag and spare vehicle key from her unsecured vehicle and used her credit cards at various locations in Charleston area.

Theft From Vehicle: 32nd Avenue. Victim reported that an unknown suspect/s stole his keys and an OHM meter from his unsecured vehicle.
