

**Isle of Palms Police Department**  
**Weekly Crime Report for July 16 – June 22, 2012**

Case Synopsis

**July 16: Monday**

Aggravated Assault: Ocean Boulevard. Victim reported meeting a Hispanic male in a local business. While she walked to her rental property, the suspect followed in his vehicle, despite her telling him to leave her alone. While in the vehicle, he grabbed her arm and hair and drove away from the scene, dragging the victim with him. Victim managed to pull loose and fell onto roadway with the vehicle running over her forearm.

Burglary: Hartnett Boulevard. Victim reported an unknown suspect/s entered into a rental property without force and stole an ice maker from the garage.

Burglary: Palmetto Drive. Victim reported that unknown suspect/s stole jewelry from a drawer.

**July 19: Thursday**

Aggravated Assault: Ocean Boulevard. Officers responded to a physical fight between two individuals; on investigation, suspect had struck the victim in the face with a fist and with a knife.

Credit Card Fraud: Palm Boulevard. Victim reported that suspect used a credit card issued to someone else to rent a house. Two months after the transaction occurred, victim notified credit card company of the fraud.

Petit Larceny: Beach @ 57<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Victim advised that four unknown males stole his surf board from the beach; the suspects left the area in two separate vehicles.

Larceny Motor Vehicle: 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Victim reported that her vehicle was stolen from Charleston County Park and unknown suspect/s used her credit cards. Suspects were located while using stolen credit cards and vehicle was located on Isle of Palms.

**July 21: Saturday**

Petit Larceny: 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect/s stole a push pole from his boat while it was moored at a dock.

**July 22: Sunday**

Vandalism: Frank Sottile Lane. Victims reported that an unknown suspect/s scratched the sides of two vehicles while in their driveway.
