

**Isle of Palms Police Department**  
**Weekly Crime Report for July 23 – July 29, 2012**

Case Synopsis

**July 25: Wednesday**

Burglary: Ocean Boulevard. Victim reported that unknown suspect/s entered into the downstairs garage area of the house, where two (2) bicycles and two (2) bottles of wine were stolen. One bicycle was later located on the beach.

**July 26: Thursday**

Harassing Phone Calls: Hartnett Boulevard. Victim reported that her ex-husband has been telephoning her several times a day cursing at her and making threats.

Vandalism: Palm Boulevard. Victim reported that he heard an object strike his vehicle while traveling in the 4300 block of Palm Boulevard; on inspection of his vehicle, he found scratches on the front and rear passenger side doors.

**July 27: Friday**

Breach of Trust: Ocean Boulevard. Victim reported that two (2) males had entered into the restaurant and ordered food; after being served, the suspects ate and then left the business without paying.

Trespassing: Allie Court. Officers responded to the report of a suspect who was at the residence despite a restraining order from a third party. On arrival, Officers learned that the individual, who had obtained the order, had it withdrawn. Officers checked with Charleston County Sheriff's Office and were advised that the order could not be located.

**July 28: Saturday**

Simple Assault: 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue. An Officer responded to a local hospital in regards to assault 3<sup>rd</sup> degree; the Officer learned that a physical altercation had occurred (between stepson and stepfather); neither subject wished to pursue charges.

**July 15: Sunday**

Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts: 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue. Victim reported by phone that while he was staying on the Isle of Palms his vehicle tag was stolen off of his car. Victim advised that he noticed the tag missing while he had stopped for gas in Columbia S.C. after leaving the Isle of Palms.
