Weekly Crime Report for September 3 – September 9, 2012

Case Synopsis

September 3: Monday

Burglary. 54th Avenue. Complainant advised that New Image Cleaning Service, had information her three flat screen TVs were missing from the rental residence. No forced entry was noted and an opened side door was found by the cleaning service on arrival. A neighbor advised that they witnessed two Hispanic males wearing green shorts walking behind the residence before the theft was discovered. The house is a rental unit for Resort Quest.

Credit Card Fraud. Twin Oaks. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) had used his credit card number to purchase items from Office Max and Best Buy. Purchases were done by phone, and victim advised that he still had the card in his possession.
