Weekly Crime Report for November 26 – December 2, 2012

Case Synopsis

November 26: Monday

Petit Larceny: 57th Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole a set of golf clubs from the garage area of his residence.

November 28: Wednesday

Burglary: Yacht Harbor. Victim reported that a known suspect had stolen a bottle of liquor from his residence while the suspect was being employed as a painter. Victim did not wish to pursue charges.

Warrant Arrest: Yacht Harbor. While investigating a petit larceny, officers learned of a warrant for suspect.

November 29: Thursday

Petit Larceny: Intracoastal Court. Victim reported that multiple tools were stolen from the end of the dock where he was working. Victim advised that he believed two former employees may be suspects in the theft.

Simple Possession Marijuana: Boardwalk Inn. While investigating a simple assault, officers located marijuana on the suspect's person.

Simple Assault: Boardwalk Inn. Victim reported that suspect attempted to steal an umbrella from the patio area of the Boardwalk Inn; when confronted by the victim, the suspect pushed her in the chest.

December 02: Sunday

Narcotic Violation: Hartnett Boulevard. During a traffic stop, officers requested to search suspect's vehicle; on consent, officers located two bottles of prescription medicine that belonged to a second suspect in the vehicle.

Vandalism: Harbor Golf course. Victim reported that damages had been done to the golf course when a vehicle was driven over the greens. Officers located a suspect who admitted to causing the damages.

Burglary: Sand Dune lane. Officers responded to a noise complaint of people yelling; on arrival officers observed a rear door had been forced open and that the suspects had been consuming alcohol at the residence.
