

Isle of Palms Police Department
Weekly Crime Report for December 10 – December 16, 2012

Case Synopsis

December 10: Monday

Vandalism: 28th Avenue. The Isle of Palms Recreation Department reported that unknown person(s) drove a vehicle through the playing fields causing damage to the grass.

Narcotics Arrest: 41st Avenue. An Officer conducting route patrol on 41st Avenue observed a vehicle disregard the stop sign at 41st Avenue and Waterway Boulevard. After conducting a lawful traffic stop on the vehicle and while speaking with the driver, the Officer observed the smell of marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. Upon further inquiry, the driver voluntarily produced a clear plastic baggie containing a green, plant-like material which field tested presumptive positive for Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). Consequently, the driver was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

December 12: Wednesday

Theft From a Motor Vehicle: Merritt Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into two of his unlocked vehicles on or about 12/10/12 and removed an iPod from within one of the vehicles; however, the victim did not report the incident at that time. On this report date, the victim stated that unknown person(s) had entered into his son's unsecured vehicle, which was parked in his driveway, and took and carried away a pair of tennis shoes.

Breach of Trust: Links Clubhouse Villas. The victim reported that an ex-tenant removed household items from his furnished rental property without his consent or permission.

December 14: Friday

Burglary: Ocean Boulevard. A property manager for a rental residence responded to the incident location to conduct an inspection. Upon arrival, the manager discovered that unknown person(s) had made forced entry through a rear bedroom door and stole three (3) flat-screened televisions from within the residence.

December 15: Saturday

Petit Larceny: Carolina Boulevard. A victim reported that while visiting the incident location, he left his wallet and iPhone unsecured in the front yard. When he returned to retrieve his property, he discovered them to have been stolen.
