

**Isle of Palms Police Department**

Case Synopsis

**December 24: Monday**

Alcohol Violation: 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Beach. An officer on patrol observed several subjects operating golf carts and drinking alcohol on the beach.

Theft From Motor Vehicle: 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) had entered into his unsecured vehicle, while it was parked in the driveway of his residence, and stole a pistol. The pistol had been recovered two days earlier in an investigation by Officers and Investigators involving a quantity of additional motor vehicle break-ins around the same area.

Petit Larceny: Whispering Palms Lane. The victim reported that during a gathering of high school friends at his residence, his iPhone 4 was stolen.

**December 26: Wednesday**

Burglary: Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) had entered into her vehicle, while it was parked in her unsecured garage, and stole several items from the vehicle including the garage door opener.

Robbery: Cameron Boulevard. Victim reported that an acquaintance (victim does not recall suspect's name) had stolen money from her purse while at her residence.

Disorderly Conduct: Ocean Boulevard. Suspect (also complainant) called the Isle of Palms Police to advise that he had been refused service and was preparing to fight. It is unknown who the suspect had directed the treat towards. Upon officer's arrival, the suspect yelled profanities and threats at everyone on scene.

Criminal Domestic Violence: 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue. A victim reported that he and his wife had been having a verbal argument over family matters when she assaulted him by punching him in the month with her fist and burning his neck with a lit cigarette.
