Case Synopsis

July 21: Monday

Burglary: Yacht Harbor Court. The complainant reported that unknown subject(s) had removed a skateboard, a bottle of rum and a watermelon from her open garage area while no one was home. Total value \$445.

July 22: Tuesday

Simple Assault: Front Beach. The complainant reported that he and his girlfriend were assaulted by a subject in the bar during an argument. Neither he nor his girlfriend wanted to pursue any charges against the unidentified male suspect.

July 23: Wednesday

Motor Vehicle Theft: 41st Ave. The complainant stated unknown subject(s) used his golf cart and returned it with damage.

July 24: Thursday

Petit Larceny: 1000 block of Ocean Blvd. The complainant stated she discovered her bicycle had been stolen when she located it at the bike rack along front beach.

Petit Larceny: Beach at Pavilion Dr. The victim placed her shoulder bag on the beach and returned to find it missing. Total value of bag and contents \$170.

Petit Larceny: Beach at Pavilion Dr. The victim placed her tote bag on the beach and returned to find it missing. Total value of the bag and contents \$350.

Petit Larceny: Beach at County Park. The complainant stated unknown subject(s) removed a lifeguard stand and two signs from the beach area overnight. Tracks from the stand were located leading to the 21st Ave beach access. Total value \$1,250.

Vandalism: 100 block of Palm Boulevard. The complainant stated unknown subject(s) damaged the wheel cover panel on his Mini Cooper vehicle (\$100).

Motor Vehicle Theft: 21st Ave Beach Access at Palm Blvd. The complainant noticed her keys missing while on the beach, she then discovered her 2003 silver Toyota 4Runner missing from where she parked it. Patrol units discovered the vehicle parked in front of a construction site at 2705 Palm Blvd, but many items had been taken from the vehicle. Total value of items from inside vehicle \$6,820.
