Weekly Crime Report for July 1 – July 7, 2013

Case Synopsis

July 1: Monday

Petit Larceny: 41st Avenue. The victim reported that she left her iPhone 4 (in a case with her S. C. driver's license) lying on the table at the restaurant, and when she returned to retrieve it, it was gone. The GPS unit activated on the phone indicated that the phone was at Rifle Range Rd.

Theft From a Motor Vehicle: 22nd Avenue. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unsecured (windows down/doors unlocked) vehicle that was parked in his driveway and stole a handgun from the center console. The stolen firearm was entered into NCIC.

July 2: Tuesday

Indecent Exposure: Cameron Boulevard. The victim stated that she was mowing her lawn when she noticed a male subject standing in the front yard of the residence adjacent to her residence, staring at her. When she took notice of the subject, he pulled down his shorts, exposed his genitals and began masturbating while staring at her. The victim stated that when she went inside to call police, the man fled on foot north on Cameron Boulevard, according to the victim.

Theft From a Motor Vehicle: Pelican Reach. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into their unsecured vehicle, which was parked underneath the residence, and stole a GPS unit and a pair of designer sunglasses. The GPS unit has been entered into NCIC.

July 3: Wednesday

Burglary: Hartnett Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her residence and stole a flat screen television. There were no signs of forced entry.

July 5: Friday

Petit Larceny: Beachwood East. The victim, a cab driver, reported that she picked up a group of subjects from the Windjammer and transported them to an address on Morgan's Place Drive. After dropping off the subjects, she realized her wallet was missing. The victim stated that she had her wallet prior to picking up the group.

Identity Theft/Fraud: Charleston Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) used her personal information to obtain at least four (4) credit cards, thereafter made fraudulent purchases.
