Case Synopsis

**October 22: Tuesday**

Theft From Vehicle: Palm Boulevard. Victim advised that an unknown suspect(s) stole his wallet from an unsecured vehicle while it was parked in the driveway.

Identity Theft: Ocean Boulevard. Victim advised that unknown suspect(s) used her identity and filed a federal tax return as her fictitious husband.

Petit Larceny: Palmetto Drive. Victim advised that unknown suspects entered into the locked, owner closet of his rental unit and stole tools, electronic equipment, and wine.  
Unit is a rental unit through owner.

**October 23: Wednesday**

Burglary: Palm Boulevard. Victim advised that unknown suspect(s) entered into his business using a key hidden under the door mat for the front door and stole money from the cash register.

Petit Larceny: Palm Boulevard. Victim advised that unknown suspect(s) stole a trailer from a vacant lot where he had secured it.

Grand Larceny: Beach Club Villas. Victim advised that they hired a moving crew to package their belonging for a move out of state. On inspection after the move, a necklace and diamond ring were found missing.

**October 24: Thursday**

Fraud: Edgewater Alley. Victim stated that he purchased an item from a business off of Craigslist but was never sent the purchased item.

Fraud: 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Victim advised that unknown suspect(s) used her credit card number to make several on-line purchases without her permission.
