

Fiscal Year 2009 Capital Improvement Projects

Water

21st Avenue to 30th Avenue and Waterway.

During the Fall/Winter of 2008 – 2009 the Commission will be replacing the existing water main on 21st Avenue and along Waterway Boulevard from 21st Avenue to 30th Avenue. The main will be installed in the South Carolina Department of Transportation Right-of-way alongside the existing main. This project will last approximately 100 days beginning on or about the 20th of October. During construction, any landscaping and other ornamentals placed in the SCDOT right-of-way without an encroachment permit will be removed at our expense but will not be replaced. The right-of-ways will be repaired with grass matching existing conditions.

Wastewater

Pump Station # 23 & Force Main Replacement

During the Fall/Winter of 2008 – 2009 the Commission will be replacing its sewer pump station located between 900 and 904 Ocean Boulevard. The force main discharging from this station will also be replaced from the station to the corner of 10th Avenue. This project will begin about October 12 and take about 4.5 months to complete.

Pump Station # 22 Force Main Extension

During the Fall/Winter of 2008 – 2009 the Commission will be extending the force main discharging from this station beginning at Tabby Lane and extend along Waterway Boulevard to our Pump Station located at 29th Avenue and Waterway Boulevard. This project will begin on or about October 27 and will take approximately 2 months to complete. This project will be along the same side of Waterway as the pedestrian path. The path will be removed between Tabby and 29th Avenue in its entirety to allow for placement of the pipe. It will be replaced at the end of the project.

During these projects, there will be temporary lane closures along the routes and possible detours when necessary. We ask that you be patient with us and our contractors as we work to improve our systems to better serve you now and in the future. We will notify all customers that may be affected by any planned outages to our system. Due to accidental damage to existing systems, there may be times when service could be temporarily interrupted.
