

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE 2020-\_\_

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and other potential methods, and presents symptoms similar to those of influenza;

WHEREAS, in December of 2019, a new and substantial outbreak of COVID-19 emerged in Wuhan, China, and has since spread rapidly to 117 countries and territories throughout the World, including the United States, and more specifically Broward County and 18 other counties in the State of Florida;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared COVID-19 a pandemic;

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is predicting that it is likely that widespread transmission of COVID-19 will also occur in the United States;

WHEREAS, no vaccine or drug is currently available to cure or combat COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the City of Isle of Palms is threatened by COVID-19 because of the apparent ability of the virus to spread rapidly among humans, and COVID-19 thereby constitutes a clear and present threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and visitors of the City of Isle of Palms;

WHEREAS, the CDC has issued guidelines for "community mitigation strategies" to limit the spread of COVID-19, including recommendations for social distancing, which has proven to be an effective method for containing COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the City of Isle of Palms is working with other government agencies in an effort to prevent the spread of disease;

WHEREAS, Governor Henry McMaster issued an executive order that closed all dine-in services at restaurants and bars beginning on Wednesday, March 18, and limiting all business to to-go/take out services only;

WHEREAS, limitations on take-out packaging by the City's Plastic Ban and the lack of products available have prohibited local businesses to provide needed food and beverage services during the state of emergency;

WHEREAS, Section 5-7-250 of the South Carolina Code of Laws empowers Council to enact emergency ordinances affecting life, health, or safety; and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the City of Isle of Palms deems it proper and necessary to adopt this emergency ordinance in order to, among other things: (a) suspend the rental and use of Short-Term Rentals, Hotels, and Other Overnight Accommodations for 29 days or less

beginning 10am Thursday, March 26, 2020 through April 30, 2020. Visitors currently checked in may remain until the end of their existing reservations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Isle of Palms, in Council assembled, that:

1. ~~Rental and use of~~ Short-Term Rentals, Hotels, and Other Overnight Accommodations for 29 days or less beginning 10am Thursday, March 26, 2020 through ~~May \_\_\_\_ April 30~~, 2020 shall be prohibited. Visitors currently checked in may remain until the end of their existing reservations.
2. Access restrictions stated in Section 7 of Emergency Ordinance 2020.01, are hereby extended to May \_\_\_\_, 2020.
3. Any violation of any rule or regulation issued and set forth herein shall be punishable as provided in Title 9, Chapter 2, Section 3: Disorderly Conduct of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Isle of Palms, ~~and including includes Section XX Seven, related to allowing ffor to suspension or revocation of business license and as a violation of S.C. Code Section 16-7-10 (Illegal acts during state of emergency, or c) any other penalties provided by State law, including penalties granted pursuant to Executive Orders issued by the South Carolina Governor, up to and including the City's authority to seek .-In addition, the Governor has authorized cities to seek an injunction, mandamus, or other appropriate legal action in the courts of the State.-~~
