The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of December 2009.

Patrol

December 3, 2009 An officer on patrol observed a vehicle make a wide turn onto Palm Boulevard from the Connector then drift over the emergency lines of the road several times, he stopped to investigate. While speaking to the driver the officer discovered that the driver had no drivers license or vehicle insurance. The driver was taken into custody and charged with No DL and Operating Uninsured.

December 5, 2009 Officers responded to a JC Long restaurant where management reported that a male subject had just left the establishment after an altercation there. It was determined that the suspect had acted inappropriately to a female patron and when warned by management he assaulted a subject, who stated he did not wish to pursue charges. Management requested that the suspect be placed on Trespass Notice. An officer located the suspect on Ocean Boulevard, where he was placed on written Trespass Notice and advised to return to his hotel room for the rest of the night.

December 6, 2009 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested assistance with an intoxicated suspect that he was attempting to arrest. An officer responded and assisted the officer in making the arrest.

December 8, 2009 An officer stopped a vehicle to investigate an equipment violation and discovered that the driver did not have a drivers license or vehicle insurance. The driver was taken into custody and charged with NO DL, No Insurance, and a warning for Defective Equipment.

December 10, 2009 An officer on patrol of the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver discovered that her license was suspended for unpaid tickets issued in North Carolina. The driver was charged with Speeding, Expired Tag, and DUS.

December 12, 2009 Just after 2 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle with an equipment violation and before he stopped it he observed the vehicle drift several times across the fog line on the right side of Palm Boulevard. The vehicle turned onto 42^{nd} Avenue and when it stopped for the officer it stopped suddenly and jumped the curb. While the officer was speaking to the driver he detected a strong odor of alcohol emitting from the open window and observed the driver to be slouched over as if she were asleep. The driver denied consuming any alcohol, but stated that she had been at two separate locations in Mount Pleasant prior to being stopped. After submitting to several Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed, she was taken into custody and transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test, where she registered a .15% level of alcohol. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

December 14, 2009 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, the Isle of Palms sent two officers to assist in a possible break-in in progress at a residence on Middle Street. Two suspects were apprehended and taken into custody and charged with Burglary.

December 14, 2009 An officer on patrol stopped a truck on Palm Boulevard near 9th Avenue for an equipment violation. A passenger in the vehicle did not have any identification so a computer check of the subject revealed that he was wanted by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office for contempt of Family Court. A Charleston County deputy responded and assumed custody of the subject.

December 14, 2009 A patrol supervisor on patrol of the beach encountered two subjects near 25th Avenue. The officer observed a female subject smoking a pipe and quickly conceal it when she saw the officer approaching. After speaking to the subject, the officer confiscated a quantity of marijuana and the glass pipe that she used to smoke it with. The subject was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and transported the Detention Center.

December 14, 2009 Officers received several 911 calls regarding a male subject walking in and out of traffic on Palm Boulevard then trying to enter vehicles and walking between nearby houses. The subject who had been described was located near 28th Avenue and determined to be highly intoxicated and was taken into custody charged with Public Intoxication.

December 17, 2009 Just before 3 A.M., a Sullivan's Island police officer requested an Isle of Palms officer to assist him with a three car accident on Middle Street that involved a possible DUI driver. He assisted the officer in getting vehicles towed and returned to the island.

December 18,2009 An officer on patrol of the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver observed an open case of beer in the vehicle. All three occupants in the vehicle were teenagers and were charged with Minor in Possession of Beer. The driver was also charged with Careless Operation.

December 20, 2009 An officer responded to a request from a Sullivan's Island police officer, who was busy on another call at the time. The officer responded to the Sullivan's Island Baptist Church, where a four- car accident had occurred. He assisted until the Sullivan's Island officer was able to respond.

December 20, 2009 An officer responded to the area of Hartnett Boulevard and 24th Avenue, where a resident had reported a suspicious vehicle parked nearby. The officer located the vehicle and encountered a male subject asleep in the back seat. The officer determined the subject was intoxicated. The subject admitted that he had been drinking and had just smoked a quantity of marijuana. He was taken into custody charged with Public Intoxication. While the officer was dealing with the male subject a female walked up to the vehicle inquiring about her friend who had just been taken into custody. She was found to be in possession of a quantity of marijuana and claimed responsibility for additional marijuana and drug paraphernalia located in the vehicle. She was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana. Both subjects were transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

December 22, 2009 Just before midnight, an officer on patrol of the Connector stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver observed an open bottle of beer. A closer inspection indicated several other bottles that had been consumed in the vehicle. The driver was charged with Open Container.

December 23, 2009 Just before 1 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver determined that he had switched license tags from another vehicle. The driver was charged with No Vehicle Insurance, No Vehicle Registration, and Borrowed License Plate.

December 27, 2009 An officer responded to the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer who requested assistance in serving an Order of Protection on a subject on Back Street.

December 28, 2009 Just before 1:30 A.M., an officer on patrol on the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding. As the officer approached the vehicle he observed an open can of beer in the floorboard of the vehicle. Both underage female occupants were in possession of beer and were charged with Underage Possession of Beer. The driver had the additional charge of Speeding.

December 28, 2009 Officers went to a Waterway Boulevard residence to follow-up on the welfare of two elderly female sisters who reside there. This was the result of concerned neighbors and relatives out of the country who made contact with the police

department via e-mail, and had not heard from them in quite some time. An officer checked on the subjects and determined that both were healthy and had deliberately had telephone service disconnected. On December 29th, an officer, the Victim Advocate Investigator, the Elder Support Coordinator from the Charleston Police Department, and an interpreter interviewed each subject and subsequently made telephone contact with their family in South America. Arrangements were made for a family member to come to South Carolina and take the eldest sister back with them.

December 31, 2009 Just before 3 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle occupied by several subjects parked behind a business and when the officer approached in his vehicle to investigate, he observed several more subjects run to the vehicle, then attempt to leave the area in a hurry. Due to their actions the officer stopped the vehicle and while speaking to the driver observed open cans of beer between the feet of rear passengers. A computer check of the driver indicated that his license to drive was suspended so he was taken into custody and charged with DUS, NRVC, Open Container, Underage Possession of Beer, No Insurance, and No Proof of Ownership. Two of the passengers were also charged with Underage Possession of Beer.

December 31, 2009 Officers responded to a residence on Twin Oaks Lane to investigate a domestic dispute. The officers determined that the dispute was only verbal in nature and both parties agreed to sleep in separate bedrooms for the remainder of the night.

Personnel/Community Relations

December 1, 2009 A recent victim of a crime sent a letter of appreciation to PFC Chavez and Detective Tarr for their diligence and professionalism in the handling of their incident.

December 3, 2009 Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe for the City of Isle of Palms Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony.

December 5, 2009 Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe at the 10th Annual Celebrity Chili Cook-Off, which benefits the Charleston Animal Society.

December 29, 2009 Lt. Wright and Sgt. Ryan received a letter of appreciation from a family member in Brazil, who expressed their thanks for the officers quick response, efficiency, and courtesy extended when they asked for assistance in checking on the welfare of their elderly relatives, whom they had not heard from in over two months.

December 31, 2009 For the month of December, officers discovered two businesses and four homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of ten Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their business during the night.


