The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of December 2008

Patrol

December 3, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Charleston Boulevard where a domestic dispute in progress had been reported. As officers arrived they heard loud yelling coming from inside the residence. The two parties involved were separated and determined to be brothers. Since the dispute was only verbal in nature and neither party had been assaulted, no action was taken as they agreed to cease their argument for the evening.

December 4, 2008 A manager of a restaurant on JC Long Boulevard reported that he had been assaulted by the boyfriend of a female employee that he had just terminated. The manager did not wish to press criminal charges but preferred to place the subject on Trespass Notice from the premises, which was done.

December 4, 2008 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation and while checking the drivers license information determined that he was wanted by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office for Failure to Appear at a previous court appearance. The driver was taken into custody and released to a Charleston County deputy.

December 5, 2008 Just before 2 A.M., an officer on patrol on the Connector observed a vehicle traveling more than 20 miles an hour over the speed limit and stopped the vehicle to investigate. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and noted that the driver had extremely bloodshot eyes,

slurred speech, and was having difficulty providing the documents he had requested. The driver was administered several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. He was taken into custody and transported to police headquarters for a Datamaser Test, where the driver refused to provide a sample. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

December 6, 2008 At approximately 2:30 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle parked in the lane of traffic on 25th Avenue. When the officer stopped to investigate, he observed someone in the front and rear passenger seat. The officer located the driver of the vehicle and determined that he gave the officer a false name. He then made the determination that the driver was intoxicated, and had two outstanding unpaid traffic tickets. He was taken into custody and charged with 2 counts of NRVC, Public Intoxication, and False Information to Police. The vehicle was towed and the two passengers left the area in a taxi.

December 6, 2008 After stopping a vehicle on the Connector for an expired license plate, the officer determined that the driver was operating on a suspended license for failure to pay six traffic tickets. The driver was taken into custody and charged with DUS, and six counts of NRVC.

December 8, 2008 Officers responded to the Isle of Palms Marina, where a case of possible credit card fraud had been reported. The responding officer was advised that a couple traveling south on the Intracoastal Waterway had stopped for the evening to rent a slip for the night and used a credit card number written on a piece of paper. The officer investigated and while speaking to the suspect determined that he had provided false personal information regarding his identity. It was determined that he was using the credit card fraudulently and was in possession of a stolen cellular telephone. It was also determined that the suspect was wanted for an outstanding Arrest Warrant for theft from the state of Virginia. The suspect was taken into custody charged with Financial Transaction Card Fraud and Hindering.

December 8, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Morgan Place Drive where a sick teenager was suffering from the ill effects of smoking marijuana. The subject identified as an eighteen year-old was transported by EMS for treatment. The officer determined that the marijuana was smoked at a residence in Mount Pleasant prior to returning home.

December 8, 2008 While officers were still on Morgan Place Drive handling the previous incident, they observed an occupied vehicle parked down the street that was determined to have been connected to the marijuana incident in Mount Pleasant. The officers identified the driver as one of the parties named in the previous incident and found that he was in possession of a case of beer and an open bottle of tequila. He was charged with Minor in Possession of Alcohol.

December 9, 2008 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for speeding and while speaking to the driver detected a strong odor of alcohol emitting from

the vehicle, and observed that the driver had bloodshot eyes, and slurred speech. After the driver admitted that he had been drinking he submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed and was taken to headquarters for a Datamaster Test. He submitted to the Datamaster Test and registered a blood alcohol level of .17%, and was charged with DUL.

December 10, 2008 After an officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector for an equipment violation. While speaking to the driver he observed in plain view, a glass pipe in a tool bag in the floorboard behind the driver. The driver admitted that he had another pipe and a bag of marijuana in the console. The driver was taken into custody and charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

December 11, 2008 Officers responded to a condominium unit in Wild Dunes, where a domestic disturbance in progress had been reported. Officers met the husband outside of his rental unit where he was with some personal belongings and determined that the dispute had been only verbal in nature. The husband wanted to leave, but still had property inside that he needed to retrieve. He was allowed to leave the area in a taxi that was called for him and he retrieved his vehicle and belongings the following day, without incident.

December 11, 2008 An officer responded to a local restaurant to meet with the owner who reported that a former employee had been harassing him on the telephone in an effort to retrieve some personal property. The officer made telephone contact with the subject and advised him that he was on Trespass Notice from the establishment.

December 14, 2008 An officer stopped a vehicle in Wild Dunes for an equipment violation and determined that the driver was in possession of a quantity of marijuana. A clear plastic bag of marijuana was found on his person and he was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

December 15, 2008 Officers responded to an Ocean Boulevard condominium unit where a brother and sister had been involved in a fight prior to the officer's arrival. The brother had left the scene, and the sister wished to pursue charges for the assault. While the officer was present, the brother returned to the unit and acted very defensively and made aggressive moves toward his sister as though he still wanted to fight her. Due to the brothers level if intoxication, and actions taken in the presence of the officer, the brother was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

December 16, 2008 An Investigator arrested a male subject after an investigation into an aggravated assault that took place at a Chapman Drive residence in March 2008. The suspect was charged with Assault and Battery with Intent to Kill.

December 17, 2008 An Isle of Palms Police Investigator has investigated the theft and fraudulent use of a check stolen from a residence on Hartnett Boulevard. Arrest Warrants for Petit Larceny and Forgery have been prepared and will be served on the suspect once she is located.

December 17, 2008 A resident of 20th Avenue reported that he had received death threats in return for undisclosed amounts of money via e-mail from a subject. The case has been assigned to an Investigator for prosecution.

December 18, 2008 Just before 2:30 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped on the Breach Inlet Bridge to investigate a suspicious looking male subject walking across the bridge. The officer identified the subject as a resident of the Isle of Palms, and also observed signs of self-mutilation on the forearms and upper arms of the subject. After speaking to the subject it was determined that the subject needed immediate medical attention and a pschychiatric evaluation, and was transported by EMS to a local hospital.

December 20, 2008 An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Palmetto Drive in Wild Dunes and while speaking to the driver determined that he had a suspended license for not paying a traffic ticket. He was charged with Speeding, DUS 1st, and NRVC.

December 20, 2008 Officers responded to a rental unit on Pavilion Drive where a domestic dispute had been reported. The officers determined that the dispute had been only verbal in nature with no evidence that anyone had been assaulted. The couple convinced the officer that they would stay in for the remainder of the evening.

December 20, 2008 An officer on patrol on JC Long Boulevard, less than an hour after handling the domestic incident on Pavilion Drive, observed the female half of that dispute stumbling across the street nearly falling, due to her intoxicated state. When the officer approached her, she became loud and boisterous and began yelling in the parking lot of a restaurant causing a scene in the presence of other patrons. She was taken into custody and charged with Intoxicated Pedestrian.

December 21, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, an officer responded to Middle Street to assist in clearing a residence, where an alarm had been activated, and someone had reported a suspicious person. Both officers checked the residence, which was clear.

December 23, 2008 An officer conducted a traffic stop on Palm Boulevard after observing a person driving that he knew had a suspended license. The driver was charged with DUS and NRVC for an unpaid traffic ticket.

December 23, 2008 Officers responded to a local laundromat, where a female subject and her son reported that they had been assaulted, and unknown suspects had fled to the rear of the building. A search of the area was conducted with negative results. The alleged adult victim then stated that the suspects might have been government officials, CIA or FBI agents. It was then apparent that the adult victim was suffering from some sort of psychiatric disorder. The case was unfounded by Investigators.

December 24, 2008 Mount Pleasant Police Department contacted the Isle of Palms Police Department regarding a hit and run accident in their jurisdiction. A witness was

able to report the license plate of the suspect vehicle, which was registered to an Isle of Palms resident. Officers went to the residence on 24th Avenue and located the suspect vehicle with fresh body damage and identified the alleged female driver. All information was passed on to the officer investigating the accident for follow-up.

December 24, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on 24th Avenue, where a resident reported a trespasser. The homeowner reported that she was wrapping Christmas gifts and heard noise outside that she assumed was her son arriving home. When the homeowner entered her living room, she encountered an unknown male subject sitting on her couch, and called 911. The responding officers located the suspect standing on the front porch, who stated that he lived at the residence with his cousin. It was readily apparent that the suspect was intoxicated. The suspect then became confrontational with members of the victims family, and the subject was charged with Trespassing.

December 25, 2008 Officers responded to a Hartnett Boulevard residence, where the wife reported that her husband had threatened her numerous times during the day with great bodily harm. She stated that she feared for her safety and for the safety of her family. She stated that the suspect had already left the residence in his vehicle. After taking a statement from the victim officers located the husbands vehicle parked in a nearby church parking lot. The suspect was located in the church fellowship hall sleeping, where he was taken into custody for Criminal Domestic Violence.

December 25, 2008 Officers responded to Tabby Lane and Waterway Boulevard where a resident reported a fight in progress, possibly involving juveniles with a weapon. The officers arrived just as the suspect vehicle was leaving the area, with at least one rear seat passenger running into a wooded area. The front seat passengers face was bloodied as a result of the fight, which required medical attention. The victim was treated by fire department First Responders and a Charleston County EMS Supervisor, and released to the custody of his parents, who took him to a local hospital for further medical treatment. After gathering written statements, it was determined that six subjects had been in the vehicle, when two subjects began to beat the victim with their fists. Once the vehicle was stopped the two suspects ran away, and a witness ran from the area as police arrived. Investigators have charged the two suspects with Simple Assault.

December 26, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island Police Officer, an Isle of Palms officer administered a Datamaster Test to a driver suspected of DUI. The test registered a .22% level of alcohol, and the subject was charged with DUI 2nd offense.

December 27, 2008 A local doctor reported that a former female employee had fraudulently presented at least three controlled narcotic prescriptions to a Mount Pleasant pharmacy. The Dr. stated that as soon as she was made aware of the matter, the suspect was terminated as an employee. The case has been assigned to an Investigator, who will prepare appropriate Arrest Warrants. A DHEC Investigator is also involved in the case for additional violations.

December 29, 2008 An officer walking on the beach observed a young male subject walking the beach in possession of a can of beer. The officer questioned the subject who turned out to be only seventeen years old. The officer walked the subject to his vehicle parked on Ocean Boulevard and discovered a second underage male in the vehicle consuming a can of beer. Both parties were charged with Minor in Possession of Alcohol then released to the custody of a guardian.

December 30, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Morgan Place Drive regarding a reported domestic dispute. It was determined that the dispute was only verbal in nature and both subjects agreed to cease their argument and stay in the home together for the rest of the evening.

Personnel/Community Relations

December 4, 2008 Several officers provided security and traffic control for the annual Christmas Tree Lighting ceremony in the business district of Ocean Boulevard.

December 28, 2008 PFC S. Baldrick, a certified Child Safety Seat Officer properly installed a child safety seat for a resident.

December 31, 2008 For the month of December, officers discovered four businesses and two homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of ninety-two Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted or to advise them that an officer checked their business during the night while on patrol.
