Due to the multiple calls received other agencies responded including Isle of Palms and Mount Pleasant Police Departments as well as Charleston County Rescue and the Department of Natural Resources. The U.S. Coast Guard helicopter did an aerial search while passing through the area. Intensive land and water searches revealed no victims. Agencies were released and personnel returned to service.
- 4/29/10 Personnel responded to the Police Department's request at the scene of a motor vehicle accident on Ocean Boulevard with no injuries. A car hit a parking meter and damaged the radiator spilling anti-freeze. Stay-dry was used and Fire Department left the scene.


Sir:
