Date: JANUARY 4, 2011

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of December 2010.

Patrol

December 1, 2010 A female subject came to the Public Safety Building and met with an officer to report that she had been sexually assaulted by her boss. The victim reported that she is employed by a painting contractor and on or about November 22, 2010 she was assaulted in a residence in Wild Dunes that they were contracted to paint. An Investigator has been assigned this case and an arrest is expected.

December 4, 2010 Officers responded to a domestic dispute on Forest Trail. After officers spoke to all parties present it was determined that the dispute had only been verbal and no assault ever took place. Both parties involved agreed to get along for the remainder of the evening.

December 5, 2010 At the request of a Sullivan's Island Police Officer, an officer responded to a residence on I'On Avenue to assist in clearing a residence found to have an open door.

December 5, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard & 9th Avenue for speeding and while speaking with the driver made the determination that her driver's license was suspended in North Carolina. The driver was charged with Speeding and DUS then released.

December 6, 2010 Officers were dispatched to a fire in the area of 26th Avenue and discovered that it was at a residence on Hartnett Boulevard. The officer spoke with a male subject present. The Fire Department doused the fire, and the resident admitted that he started the fire for warmth, due to the fact that his residence did not have a heating system. The fire was confined to a mattress and a dog house. A computer check of the subject indicated that he had three unpaid traffic tickets and was charged with 3 counts of NRVC.

December 7, 2010 An officer responded to a residence on Forest Trail and met with a representative of a real estate group who was at the residence on behalf of a bank that had foreclosed on the property. They reported that the Sheriff's Office had served an Eviction Notice to vacate by December 2nd, and the residents had in fact left, but they left two vehicles and had maliciously damaged the property. The locks were changed and the former owners were advised that they were no longer allowed on the property.

December 10, 2010 A resident of 43rd Avenue reported that he has noticed that prescription medication was missing after a maid service has cleaned his residence. The homeowner reported that he deliberately planted medication out to see if it would be taken after the next visit by the cleaning crew, which resulted in another theft. An Investigator has been assigned the case.

December 11, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard near 38th Avenue for speeding and an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver he immediately detected a strong odor of freshly burned marijuana. After receiving consent to search the vehicle, the officer located marijuana in numerous places in the vehicle along with drug paraphernalia. The driver was given a warning for speeding and charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

December 12, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped to investigate a suspicious vehicle parked at the Marina on 41st Avenue and when he looked inside he observed marijuana and drug paraphernalia in plain view in the front seat. Several minutes later the officer observed a male subject leave the area driving that vehicle. The officer stopped the vehicle and determined that the driver had removed what he had previously observed and it was now in the driver's pocket. The driver was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

December 12, 2010 Just after 11 P.M., an officer responded to an area of Hartnett Boulevard for reported suspicious activity. The officer encountered two subjects nearby on bicycles and stopped to speak with them. One subject was found to be in possession of a quantity of marijuana and was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

December 13, 2010 An officer responded to a lot on Morgan Place Drive where a subject reported that his locked construction trailer had been broken into. He reported that a boat motor and two oars were missing and they were valued at \$2,575. The victim reported a possible suspect as a former employee. A computer check by an Investigator indicated that the motor had been pawned at a North Charleston Pawn Shop. The pawn shop was immediately notified and an Arrest Warrant for the former employee is forthcoming.

December 15, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on Hartnett Boulevard to investigate a disturbance at that location. After speaking to all three parties involved, it was determined that the disturbance was a verbal altercation between two parties who were not related. The matter was quickly resolved without further incident.

December 16, 2010 An officer assisted FBI Agents who had an Arrest Warrant for a male subject at a residence on Morgan Place Drive. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

December 19, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver observed a case of beer in the floor of the vehicle. Since the driver was only seventeen years old he was cited for Minor in Possession of Beer.

December 21, 2010 Just before 1 A.M., officers responded to a Front Beach establishment for a possible physical altercation in progress at a private party. While officers were speaking to the subjects involved in the altercation, and arranging for transportation to remove them from the area, an intoxicated female subject continually interfered with the officers by shouting profanities and refusing to leave the area. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

December 25, 2010 Officers stood by while Charleston County Sheriff's Office Deputies responded to the City Marina to meet a male subject who threatened suicide while at his Goat Island residence. The subject's wife brought her husband to the Marina by boat and was met by EMS and Fire Department personnel. The subject voluntarily went with EMS to East Cooper Hospital for evaluation.

December 26, 2010 Just before 2 A.M., officers responded to a JC Long establishment, where a fight in progress was reported by management. While responding, a description of three male suspects involved and their vehicle was dispatched, since they had just left the area. Officers determined from management and witnesses that at least three persons had been assaulted after the three suspects were asked to leave the business. Most of the incident occurred in the parking lot, which resulted in injuries to three employees. Employees were able to provide names and descriptions of the three suspects. An officer stayed at the business to obtain written statements while another officer responded to East Cooper Hospital. After meeting with the suspects at the hospital, all three were charged with Assault & Battery 3rd Degree and placed on written Trespass Notice from the establishment then transported to the Detention Center.

December 27, 2010 An officer responded to the Isle of Palms Recreation Department where management reported a vandalism to a public restroom. Video surveillance cameras were reviewed and it was determined that two subjects were probably responsible. The case has been assigned to an Investigator.

December 27, 2010 Just after 11 P.M., an officer on patrol of the Connector observed a vehicle traveling in front of her that was operating erratically. The in car camera was activated to document the driving and the vehicle was stopped. The female driver had slurred speech, bloodshot eyes, and had trouble providing the paperwork requested. While speaking to the driver, the officer observed a plastic bag sticking out of a pocket that contained a small amount of marijuana. Other drug paraphernalia was located as well as two off-white rock like substances which tested positive as cocaine. The driver was taken into custody charged with Possession of Cocaine Base and given a warning for Improper Lane Usage and transported to the Detention Center.

December 28, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on Carolina Boulevard after a resident called to report persons knocking at her door. Prior to the officer's arrival, the resident reported that the group was leaving the area in a grey SUV. An officer observed the suspect vehicle and stopped it on Palm Boulevard near 4th Avenue. The vehicle was occupied by six teenagers and driven by a fifteen year old female, who was unable to produce a license. The officer detected an odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and all occupants were determined to be sixteen or younger. Two females were found to be in possession of marijuana and one with alcohol. Two were charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and one with Possession/Consumption of Alcohol Under 21. Due to their age, all were referred to Family Court. All occupants were released to their respective parents.

December 29, 2010 Just before 1:30 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle with an open door and interior light on, in a carport at a residence on Beachside Drive. The officer stopped to investigate

and encountered a male subject with a flashlight, who responded incoherently to questions asked by the officer. The subject stated he was a tenant and went into the residence to retrieve the lease. Officers observed the interior of the residence to be in complete disarray with indications that a possible struggle may have taken place. Based on what was observed, the officers made the decision to enter the residence to check on the welfare of anyone else that may be present. Telephone contact was made with the owner of the residence, who responded from Mount Pleasant. He stated that he had just leased the residence to the suspect seven hours earlier, and at that time the residence was in pristine condition. Once the owner arrived he toured the residence and confirmed that all of the damage must have been done in the previous seven hours. Some artwork that had been hanging on the walls had been loaded into the suspect's vehicle. Every piece of furniture, every appliance, and every light receptacle in the residence had been damaged beyond repair, with an estimated replacement and repair cost of \$35,000. The suspect admitted to an officer that he did the damage, and was charged with Malicious Damage to Real Property and Petit Larceny, and immediately lodged in the Detention Center to await a Bond Hearing. The suspect's vehicle was towed from the residence. Later that day, after bonding out of jail and retrieving his vehicle from the towing company, the same subject intentionally struck a vehicle head on in Mount Pleasant, after intentionally revving up the engine and backing into another vehicle at the intersection of US 17 and Long Point Road. A citizen reported that the suspect was behind an Isle of Palms police vehicle. That officer, on his way to work got behind the vehicle in question, stopped it, and detained the driver for a Mount Pleasant officer to respond. Mount Pleasant Police charged the subject with two counts of Assault and Battery 1st Degree, after he stated that he was trying to rid the world of sinners.

December 30, 2010 Officers responded to a Cameron Boulevard residence at the request of a counselor who asked that officers check on the welfare of a male subject who stated he wanted to end his life. Fire Department First Responders and EMS personnel responded and the subject was transported to a local hospital for evaluation.

December 31, 2010 Just after 2:30 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for a broken taillight, which was occupied by six subjects. While speaking to the driver, the officer immediately detected an odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. As the front passenger was exiting the vehicle, the officer observed a marijuana stem in the floorboard of the vehicle. All six occupants were then asked to exit the vehicle and one subject stated that all six of them had been drinking alcohol. One male subject was found to be in possession of a bag of marijuana. Another subject admitted to the officer that another bag of marijuana was in the glove compartment. The subject who had the marijuana in his pocket admitted that the marijuana in the glove compartment was also his. Two purses in the vehicle were also found to have quantities of marijuana in them. The female driver of the vehicle was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana, Underage Possession of Alcohol, and Defective Equipment. A male passenger was charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol, and Possession of Marijuana with the Intent to Distribute. A female passenger was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and Underage Possession of Alcohol. The three remaining passengers were charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol. When a male passenger was informed that he was being arrested he became very irate, cursing loudly and began twisting and pulling away from the officers while being escorted to the transportation vehicle, and while doing so, he also spit in an officers face. He had the additional charges of Resisting Arrest, and Assault of a Police Officer While Resisting Arrest. All six subjects were transported to the County Detention Center in a Mount Pleasant Police Department Transport Van.

December 31, 2010 Officers met with a Department of Social Services (DSS) Social Worker to assist them in visiting a residence on Forest Trail to investigate a possible assault on a child at that residence.

While present, the suspect admitted that she had marijuana in the residence and turned over a bag weighing approximately 9.3 grams to the officer. She was issued a citation for Simple Possession of Marijuana and not arrested, due to her medical condition. The investigation by DSS continues.

Personnel/Community Relations

December 2, 2010 Officers provided security for the Annual Holiday Tree Lighting Ceremony, by closing off a portion of Ocean Boulevard and directing traffic around the event.

December 4, 2010 At the request of Cpl. Paul Brouters, the Public Information Officer for the South Carolina Highway Patrol in the Charleston area, Sgt. Ryan played the Highland Bagpipe at the 11th Annual Celebrity Chili Cook-Off, which is a charity event that benefits the Charleston Animal Society.

December 4, 2010 Animal Control Officer Keelan received a letter of appreciation from a citizen complimenting him on his quick response in removing a dead animal near a school bus stop minutes after it was called in by the citizen.

December 10, 2010 Ptl. Robert Nelson and Ptl. Chris Quinn graduated from the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy. The ceremony was attended by Chief Buckhannon, Lt. Wright, and several other officers. Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe as part of the graduation program.

December 31, 2010 For the month of December, officers discovered six businesses and five homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of one hundred three Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol.

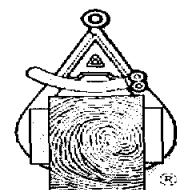
