The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March 2010.

#### Patrol:

March 1, 2010 An Investigator conducting a follow-up interview at a residence on Hartnett Boulevard determined that a construction worker at that location was wanted by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The Investigator arranged for a Deputy to respond and assume custody of the subject.

March 1, 2010 Officers responded to an accident at 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue & Ocean Boulevard and upon their arrival found a pickup truck occupied by an elderly couple resting against a condominium unit on Ocean Boulevard. The driver stated that his brakes failed while coming down the Connecter then across Palm Boulevard onto 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue traveling over the a curb through bushes coming to rest against a building. Both occupants were transported to the hospital and treated for head and neck injuries and the vehicle was towed from the scene. The investigating officer was informed several days after the accident that the female passenger had expired in the hospital as a result of her injuries. As a result of the fatality the investigating officer, who is an accident reconstructionist and the South Carolina Highway Patrol, obtained a Search Warrant and inspected the vehicle and circumstances surrounding the accident. The driver was not charged.

March 3, 2010 Just after 2 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle traveling on the Connector weaving within the lane of traffic failing to dim high beam headlights to approaching traffic. Once stopped the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol emitting from the open window of the vehicle. The driver submitted to several

Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed. The driver was taken into custody and transported to the Detention Center for a Datamaster Test. The driver refused to provide a sample for the Datamaster and was charged with DUI. It was also determined that the passenger was wanted in the state of Colorado for failure to appear in court there, but they declined to extradite and she was released and given a ride to her residence.

March 3, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue with an expired license plate. After speaking to the driver it was determined that the drivers license was suspended due to a drug conviction. The subject was charged with DUS and Expired License Plate.

March 3, 2010 Just before midnight a male subject made a request that officers check on the welfare of his brother who has a residence on Ocean Boulevard. Officers responded and reported that no one was at the residence. Sometime before 1 A.M., the Charleston City Police Department called and made the same request and again the residence in question was found to be unoccupied. Just after 4 A.M. we were notified that the subject was found deceased in his vehicle at the Wappoo Cut Boat Landing, which is being investigated by the Charleston Police Department.

March 4, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for a seat belt violation. While speaking to the driver the officer determined that the driver did not have a license to operate the vehicle due to non-payment of three prior traffic tickets. The driver was taken into custody charged with DUS 3<sup>rd</sup> offense and NRVC x 3.

March 5, 2010 Narcotics Detectives from the Charleston County Sheriff's Office requested that a female police officer respond to a residence on 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to conduct a search of females detained where they were executing a Search Warrant.

March 5, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector for an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver observed a quantity of beer in the vehicle. Since the driver was only nineteen he was charged with Underage Possession of Beer, Underage Possession of Liquor, and Transport of Liquor w/ Broken Seal. The alcohol was seized and the passenger was allowed to drive the vehicle from the scene.

March 6, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The officer then observed a beer can spilled in the rear floorboard behind the driver. After taking the driver into custody the officer located a quantity of marijuana and a marijuana pipe in the center console of the vehicle. The driver was charged with Open Container and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

March 8, 2010 Just before 2 A.M., an officer on patrol of the Connector observed a speeding vehicle and followed it to Palm Boulevard where the vehicle failed to stop for the red traffic signal and strike the cement median while turning left onto Palm Boulevard. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was charged with Reckless Driving.

March 9, 2010 While on patrol of the Connector an officer observed a vehicle in front of his drifting in and out of the lane of traffic. The officer stopped to investigate and while speaking to the driver detected an odor of alcohol and observed the driver to have glassy and bloodshot eyes. The officer then observed an open can of beer on top of clothing in the rear seat, which was still cold. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed and was taken into custody and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center for a Datamaster Test where he refused to provide a sample. The driver was charged with DUI.

March 10, 2010 At the request of the Sullivan's Island Police Department an officer responded to Sullivan's Island Elementary School to assist in clearing the building after a door was found unsecured.

March 10, 2010 Just before midnight an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Waterway Boulevard for a turn signal and equipment violation and after running a computer check of the driver made the determination that that he was wanted in Kentucky by the Louisville Metro Police Department. Contact was made with that department who advised that they would extradite the subject for the charge. The driver was taken into custody and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center to await extradition.

March 11, 2010 An officer responded to the Dorchester County Jail to assume custody of a male subject who was wanted by this agency for two outstanding Arrest Warrants for a Burglary that occurred on Palm Boulevard in 2008. The subject was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center where warrants were served for Burglary 1<sup>st</sup> degree and Grand Larceny.

March 12, 2010 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer an officer responded to Station 28 ½ and Atlantic Avenue for assistance in arresting an intoxicated subject on a traffic stop.

March 12, 2010 An officer on patrol near Breach Inlet observed an extremely slow moving vehicle come across the bridge onto the Isle of Palms. The officer stopped the vehicle to check on the welfare of the driver and while speaking to the driver detected an odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver denied that he had consumed any alcohol, but had trouble rolling down his window and providing the necessary paperwork for the vehicle. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests the driver was transported to headquarters to be administered a Datamaser Test. After waiting for the required twenty minutes the driver stated he would rather submit to a blood test. He was transported to East Cooper Hospital where blood was taken. The driver was charged with DUI and Open Container and transported to the Detention Center.

March 12, 2010 An officer responded to a residence on Oak Harbor Boulevard where a boat was reported almost completely submerged at a dock behind the residence on Hamlin Creek. The officer immediately observed a fuel spill hazard and notified the fire department that responded to control the spill. The Coast Guard was notified and

responded to supervise the containment of the fuel and oil spill and the safe salvage of the 34- foot boat.

March 13, 2010 Two officers standing on Ocean Boulevard near 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue observed a couple exit a bar in an obvious state of intoxication. They stated "trust us, we aren't driving, just walking over there to wait on a friend". The officers then observed both subjects quickly walk to a parked vehicle, start the vehicle and attempt to back out of a parking space. The vehicle was immediately stopped and the male driver was taken into custody charged with Public Intoxication. The vehicle was towed for safekeeping.

March 14, 2010 At 4:30 A.M., an officer responded to Lake Village Lane in Wild Dunes where a domestic dispute had been reported. The officer determined that the dispute was verbal in nature with no evidence that any physical assault had occurred. The situation was defused for the remainder of the night.

March 14, 2010 Just after 4 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped to investigate a vehicle parked awkwardly in two parking spaces in a shopping center on Palm Boulevard. The vehicle was running and a male subject behind the steering wheel appeared to unconscious. A second subject was in the same state in the rear seat of the vehicle. Both subjects were awakened and the driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests and was taken into custody. During the Datamaster Test the driver refused to provide a sample and was charged with DUI. Both subjects in the vehicle were also charged with No Overnight Sleeping in Vehicle.

March 14, 2010 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested assistance at a bar on Middle Street to assist with two female subjects that he had in custody. Since that officer had to go to MUSC for one of the two who was injured, an Isle of Palms officer transported the other subject to the Detention Center.

March 15, 2010 The police department was contacted by the Dekalb County Medical Examiners Office in Georgia and advised by an Investigator that the son of an Isle of Palms resident had been discovered deceased. It was requested that notification be made so the deceased mother would make telephone contact with their agency. An officer went to the residence on Linkside Court accompanied by two Chaplains from Coastal Police Chaplaincy to make appropriate death notification.

March 17, 2010 Just before 2 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle on Palm Boulevard operating erratically and stopped it on Palmetto Drive after it entered Wild Dunes. After speaking to the driver it was determined that he was operating with a suspended license. He was charged with Reckless Driving, DUS, No Proof of Insurance, and Expired Vehicle Registration.

March 17, 2010 Officers responded to a noise complaint at a residence on Carolina Boulevard and while speaking to a subject who came to the door observed several subjects present drinking beer who appeared to be under the age of twenty-one. When an officer asked the subject he was speaking to to gather up the subjects that he saw drinking

so he could check their identification, he tried to slam the door on the officer to prevent entry. That subject was taken into custody charged with Transferring Beer to Minors and Hindering. Six additional subjects were charged with Underage Possession of Beer. One of those subjects was found hiding in a bedroom and was also charged with Hindering.

March 19, 2010 An officer on patrol of the 700 block of Ocean Boulevard stopped to speak with four visibly underage male subjects in possession of beer. The officer determined that all of the subjects were either 18 or 19 years old and were all charged with Underage Possession of Beer and No Alcohol on Street.

March 19, 2010 Just after 3 A.M., a Sullivan's Island police officer requested assistance in responding to a residential alarm on Myrtle Avenue. Once the residence was searched the officer returned to the Isle of Palms.

March 20, 2010 Just before midnight an officer on patrol on Carolina Boulevard observed two subjects sitting in front of a residence in the rear compartment of an SUV consuming alcohol. They stated they got the beer from inside of the residence where they were parked. The officer went to the residence and spoke with someone at the door who allowed the officer in the residence where 7 underage subjects, male and female were consuming alcohol. A total of 9 subjects were charged with Underage Possession of Beer. All alcohol present was photographed and destroyed. One subject present was also charged with Hindering and Violation of the Vehicle Occupancy Ordinance.

March 20, 2010 Just before 3 A.M., an officer on foot at the Island Center checking businesses observed a vehicle quickly enter the parking lot and observed the driver open the door and get sick. The officer approached to check on the welfare of the driver immediately detecting a strong odor of alcohol. The driver was extremely unsteady on her feet and submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed. After submitting to a Datamaster Test, which registered a .11% level of alcohol the driver was charged with DUI.

March 21, 2010 Just before 2 a.m. an officer was dispatched to Cameron Boulevard regarding an accident. The officer determined that an SUV had struck a parked vehicle. The officer located the SUV down the street occupied by a male driver. The officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol and open beer in plain view. The driver was identified as an 18-year-old college student. Due to the age of the driver he was taken to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .09% level of alcohol. He was charged with Zero Tolerance/Under 21and Underage Possession of Alcohol.

March 21, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped at a Palm Boulevard convenience store to speak with a male subject in a pickup truck that he knew to have a suspended drivers license. A computer check of the subject indicated that he was still under suspension and was now wanted by the North Charleston Police Department for Assault and Battery of a High and Aggravated Nature. The subject was taken into custody and turned over to the custody of a North Charleston police officer.

March 22, 2010 A Sullivan's Island police officer reported that a suspect vehicle involved in a hit and run accident was heading toward the Isle of Palms. A description of the vehicle was broadcast and the vehicle was spotted on Palm Boulevard near 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue and stopped by an Isle of Palms officer. The Sullivan's Island officer responded to the traffic stop to complete his accident investigation.

March 26, 2010 Just before midnight an officer on patrol observed a vehicle weaving out of the lane of traffic and halfway into the emergency lane. The vehicle was stopped and as the driver exited his vehicle he had great difficulty maintaining his balance as well as a strong odor of alcohol coming from his person. When asked, the driver stated that he had too much to drink. The officer quickly determined that the driver's license had been suspended since 2003. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests then refused to provide a sample for the Datamaster Test. The driver was charged with DUI and DUS.

March 27, 2010 An officer on foot patrol on the Front Beach observed an intoxicated male subject attempt to negotiate with difficulty the stairwell at an establishment while holding a cup of liquor in each hand. Due to the potential danger of falling the officer asked the subject to stop several times. Since the subject was in no condition to drive and had no one to call for a ride he was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication and No Alcohol on the Street.

March 28, 2010 Two officers on foot patrol of the Front Beach observed a male subject urinating in the bushes in full view of others standing on nearby balconies. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

March 28, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector after someone called the police department stating they thought the driver was intoxicated. The officer observed the vehicle and clocked it with radar doing 85 miles per hour then observed the vehicle weave into the right emergency lane. Once stopped, the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol and observed the driver having trouble responding to simple requests. The driver then refused to submit to any Field Sobriety Tests then also refused to provide a sample for the Datamaster Test. The officer determined that the driver was presently under suspension for a previous DUI where he registered greater than a .15% level of alcohol, as well as two prior convictions for DUI. The driver was charged with DUI 3<sup>rd</sup> offense, DUS, and Open Container in a Vehicle.

March 29, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on  $22^{nd}$  Avenue to check on the welfare of a female subject there. The adult son of the female was on the way from Aiken County to get his mother and while speaking to her earlier she was crying and arguing with her live in boyfriend. Officers encountered the couple at the residence and made the determination that both parties had been drinking alcohol, which contributed to the domestic dispute. The female subject stated that she was not in fear for her safety and would wait for her son to arrive to take her home with him.

March 30, 2010 An officer on patrol of the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver he observed open beer containers in cup holders in the vehicle. Since the driver was unable to provide proof of ownership he was taken into custody and charged with Speeding, No Proof of Ownership, No Proof of Insurance, and Open Container. Two passengers in the vehicle were asked to exit so an inventory could be done prior to towing. The front seat passenger was found to be in possession of a bag of marijuana and a quantity of powdered substance identified as Adderall and was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and Possession of a Schedule II Substance. A female passenger in the rear seat was found to be in possession of a quantity of ecstasy and was charged with Possession of a Schedule I-V Substance. All were transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

#### Personnel/Community Relations:

March 3, 2010 A Hurricane Disaster Drill organized and planned by the police department occurred. The drill, which lasted three hours involved employees from every department in the City, whose personnel manned the Emergency Operations Center in the Public Safety Building. At the conclusion of the drill County and State Emergency Operations officials critiqued the drill.

March 14, 2010 At the request of the Chief Executive Officer of the East Cooper Medical Center, Sgt. J. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe for the opening ceremony of the new facility.

March 27, 2010 Chief Buckhannon, Sgt. Meekins, and Det. Tarr attended the Wild Dunes Homeowners Association Meeting. A display table was set up with informative brochures and questions were answered and information provided to all in attendance.

March 31, 2010 Sgt. K. Usry was Employee of the Month representing the police department. She was recognized for her planning and resourcefulness in organizing the Hurricane Disaster Drill earlier in the month.

March 31, 2010 For the month of March, officers discovered four businesses and four homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of twenty Victim of Crime Forms and one hundred ninety- nine Property Security Checks were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their business during the night while on patrol.
