The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May 2010.

## **Patrol:**

May 1, 2010 A female subject came to police headquarters to provide a written statement for an unrelated incident and was taken into custody for an outstanding Arrest Warrant through the Berkeley County Family Court for Failure to Pay Child Support. An officer transported the subject to 526 and Long Point Road where a Berkeley County Sheriff's Deputy assumed custody for incarceration.

May 2, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue for doing 51 miles per hour on Palm Boulevard. When the officer spoke to the driver he immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver had slurred speech and was unable to provide the requested paperwork. While attempting to conduct Field Sobriety Tests the driver became argumentative and refused to submit to anymore testing. The driver was transported to headquarters so a Datamaster Test could be administered, but when the time came to provide a sample the driver refused. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

May 2, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on the 500 block of Ocean Boulevard where a resident reported a female at their door asking for help. The subject complained that she was scared, but could not explain why. She was transported to headquarters and her vehicle was towed for safekeeping. At headquarters officers were able to contact a roommate for a ride home. While waiting in the lobby the subject appeared to be sensitive to light and any noise that she heard. She then admitted that she had consumed the drug ecstasy, which explained her behavior. Fire Department personnel and EMS

were notified and responded to treat the subject who was transported to East Cooper Medical Center for further treatment and evaluation.

May 6, 2010 An officer traveling in an unmarked vehicle was cut off on Palm Boulevard near JC long Boulevard by a van leaving the nearby gas station. Once the vehicle was stopped, the officer determined that the driver had an expired license and no proof of insurance for the vehicle. He was charged with Careless Operation, Expired DL, and No Proof of Insurance.

May 6, 2010 An officer from the Mount Pleasant Police Department requested that one of our officers ride by an address on 42<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to see if a vehicle was present that had been involved in a hit and run accident earlier in their jurisdiction. The vehicle in question was present and Mount Pleasant Police were notified and responded to investigate their accident.

May 7, 2010 Officers responded to The Village at Wild Dunes where management reported that several guests complained that a loud argument was occurring in a nearby unit. The officers met with a couple in their room, who stated they had been having a heated verbal argument that was now over. Both parties agreed that there would be no further disturbances for the remainder of the night.

May 8, 2010 Officers responded to Cameron Boulevard and 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue and met with a female subject and two friends who reported she had been sexually assaulted in a nearby residence on Palm Boulevard. All three pointed out the residence to officers. Two Investigators responded to the area to get more specific information from the subjects. A description of the suspect was given to officers, who went to the residence and gathered all 13 occupants for identification purposes. The victim and her friends positively identified the suspect from a lineup and he was taken into custody charged with Criminal Sexual Conduct 3<sup>rd</sup> degree. The room that the incident occurred in was processed for evidence. The victim was then taken to a local medical facility for forensic testing. A Search Warrant was conducted on the suspect the following day for DNA comparison. The suspect, who is from New York, was released the following day to the custody of his attorney after a Bond Hearing and posting a \$30,000 surety bond.

May 8, 2010 An officer responded to a residence on Palm Boulevard at the request of fire department personnel who had responded there to a possible natural death. The officer met with the decedents husband and Hospice Nurse and made notification to the Coroners Office. The officer stayed at the residence until the funeral home removed the deceased.

May 8, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on Palmetto Drive, at the request of Mobile Crisis, who advised that a female at the residence had made contact with them regarding suicidal statements and actions made by her husband. Officers made contact with the male subject who agreed to voluntarily and immediately seek assistance from Palmetto Lowcountry Behavioral Health in Charleston. Two agents from Mobile Crisis accompanied the subject to that facility without further incident.

May 8, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on Carolina Boulevard where a neighbor reported trespassers. The officers encountered 4 subjects swimming in the pool. One subject stated that he does work for the homeowner who gave him permission to use the pool. The officer ran a computer check of the subjects and determined that one was wanted by the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office for drug distribution. He was taken into custody and transported to a location to meet with a Berkeley County Deputy.

May 9, 2010 A Sullivan's Island police officer had a female subject in custody for DUI and requested that one of our Certified Datamaster Officer's administer a Datamaster Test at our Public Safety Building.

May 9, 2010 An officer responded to the 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Beach Access where a vehicle was found to be stuck in the sand on the access. A couple was waiting near the vehicle stating that they had already called a tow truck. The officer had to call another towing company who agreed to hold the vehicle until the tow was paid for. The driver of the vehicle was issued a ticket for Unlawful Vehicle on Beach.

May 10, 2010 An officer responded to Wild Dunes, at the request of Wild Dunes Security, who was out with an intoxicated male subject who had fallen from a golf cart at Palmetto Drive and Edgewater Alley. The officer met the operator of the golf cart and found him to be highly intoxicated and unable to state where he was staying. He was taken into custody for Public Intoxication. While dealing with this subject a citizen reported a hit and run accident involving a golf cart that struck her vehicle that had been legally parked on Grand Pavilion. The description of the driver of the golf cart matched that of the subject that had been taken into custody. Damage to the golf cart and paint transfer matched that of the vehicle on Grand Pavilion. The subject was then transported to police headquarters where several Field Sobriety Tests were administered. The subject submitted to a Datamaster Test and registered a .24% level of alcohol. His Public Intoxication arrest was upgraded to DUI and he was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

May 11, 2010 Just before midnight, an officer on patrol near Breach Inlet stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for traveling 16 miles per hour over the speed limit. While speaking to the driver the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol. The driver denied having consumed any alcohol, but had slurred speech, and bloodshot glassy eyes. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was taken into custody and transported to headquarters to be administered a Datamaster Test, which registered a .15% level of alcohol. The driver was charged with DUI and Possession of Another's DL. The second charge was the result of the driver having possession someone else's drivers license that indicated he was over 21.

May 14, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue where a possible overdose of drugs had been reported. Upon arrival the officer observed a teenage male subject on the couch unresponsive and barely breathing. Fire Department personnel performed first aid until EMS arrived to transport the subject to the hospital. It was then

determined that the subject arrived at the residence to visit his friend and before he passed out told his friend that he had ingested Methadone and Xanax.

May 14, 2010 Just before midnight, a resident of Ocean Boulevard reported someone at his front door attempting to break into his house. Officers responded and located an extremely intoxicated male subject on the front deck mumbling unintelligibly. Due to the subjects level of intoxication and inability to state where he was staying he was taken into custody charged with Public Intoxication.

May 15, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Pavilion Drive near the Municipal Parking Lot to speak with the occupants for not wearing seat belts. While speaking to the three occupants, the officer observed open containers of beer in the vehicle. The driver was taken into custody charged with Open Container and No Seat Belt. The officer then located a quantity of marijuana in the floorboard of the right front passenger compartment. That passenger was taken into custody and charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana, Open Container, Underage Possession of Beer, and 6 counts of NRVC for failure to pay six traffic tickets. The third occupant was also charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

May 16, 2010 Officers responded to the County Park after a domestic dispute had been reported. The officers met with a husband and wife and interviewed several witnesses. It was determined that the male subject had caused a scene on the beach yelling loud profanities, which were heard by dozens of beachgoers in the vicinity. The male subject was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

May 16, 2010 Officers responded to the County Park, where management reported a couple in a vehicle in the parking lot having sex. The officers located the two subjects who both admitted to having had consensual sex in the back seat of the vehicle. The female was a juvenile, but of age to give consent. She was charged however, with Disorderly Conduct and Underage Possession of Liquor, which will be referred to Family Court. The male subject was charged with Disorderly Conduct. The female was released to the custody of her parents, who responded from Summerville.

May 16, 2010 Officers responded to a Front Beach restaurant regarding an intoxicated female patron refusing to leave the premises. Management stated that they had asked the subject to leave several times and she refused to do so. When an officer asked her to leave the premises she again refused and was taken into custody charged with Public Intoxication.

May 17, 2010 Officers responded to Lagoon Villas to assist the Fire Department in locating a 91 year- old female who became separated from her daughter while walking back from the beach. After a short search the lady was located near the beach.

May 17, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on Cameron Boulevard regarding a domestic disturbance. Officers met with a visibly upset pregnant female in the driveway. Her husband was observed standing near a vehicle in the driveway in an obvious state of

anger, since he was clenching his jaw, flexing his bloody hands, and opening and closing his fists. He was placed in a vehicle until officers could determine if any domestic violence occurred. An argument occurred after he returned to the residence under the influence of alcohol, when he became so enraged that he threw items at his wife striking her several times. While the officers were present, the male subject began punching a support pillar on the front porch, which caused abrasions to his knuckles. He was taken into custody charged with Criminal Domestic Violence and transported to the Detention Center.

May 18, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for disregarding a stop sign at 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue and Palm Boulevard. A computer check of the drivers record indicated that she was wanted by the Mount Pleasant Police Department for Forgery and Identity Theft. A Mount Pleasant Police Officer responded to assume custody of the driver. Found in the driver's possession were several credit cards belonging to other persons. This evidence was turned over to the Mount Pleasant officer.

May 19, 2010 An Isle of Palms officer responded to Sullivan's Island Elementary School at the request of a Sullivan's Island officer who had located an open door. The school was cleared with no sign of illegal entry.

May 22, 2010 A woman staying at a residence on Cameron Boulevard came to police headquarters to report that when she woke up that morning her husband was not in the residence. He was last seen on the beach just before 2 A.M. After searching for more than 2 hours, the subject was located. The subject had become intoxicated and disoriented, and had returned to the wrong house and fell asleep. The home that the subject slept in was an unoccupied rental. The rental company only wanted to be reimbursed for the cost to re-clean the residence and made financial arrangements with the person who had been missing.

May 23, 2010 An officer on foot patrol of the Front Beach encountered a female subject walking on Ocean Boulevard carrying an alcoholic beverage. The officer determined that she was impaired. Friends of the woman pulled up in a vehicle and agreed to take her home, which the officer allowed them to do. The officer then observed the friends stop near a vehicle in the Municipal Parking Lot and saw the impaired female get into her vehicle and attempt to drive. The officer went to the vehicle and took the subject into custody charging her with Public Intoxication and No Alcohol on Beach or Streets.

May 23, 2010 Officers accompanied two Mount Pleasant Police Officers who had an Arrest Warrant for a female living on 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. The wanted subject was present at the residence and was taken into custody for the drug related charge.

May 24, 2010 A subject wanted for Breach of Trust turned himself in at police headquarters to be processed at the Detention Center. The warrant was obtained by an Investigator in November 2009 after a citizen reported that he had given a large sum of money to a contractor for work to be done on his house that was never done.

May 25, 2010 A female subject who had been washing clothes at a local Laundromat reported that her wallet had been stolen when she left it unattended. A suspect has been identified and an Investigator has been assigned to follow-up on the matter.

May 25, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue to a reported domestic disturbance. Upon arrival the officers made the determination that a female, who had been visiting her brother was assaulted during a heated argument after he asked her to leave. Visible evidence confirmed the assault and he was taken into custody charged with Simple Assault.

May 26, 2010 A male subject came to the police department on an unrelated matter and after a computer check of the subject, it was determined that he was wanted by the North Charleston Police Department for Simple Possession of Marijuana. An officer transported the subject to a prearranged location to turn him over to the custody of a North Charleston officer.

May 28, 2010 Officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence to a report by a local realty company that their clients returned home to find they had no power. It appeared that someone had pulled the electric meter from the outside power box and had also cut phone and cable lines. While officers walked around outside of the residence they observed a large flat screen TV, a sound system, and other electronic gear inside of the fence of the residence next door. A closer look indicated the next- door residence had been burglarized and the items left as though someone were going to return them. Investigators arrived and made the decision to leave and keep the residence under surveillance. A short time later, a male subject in an SUV arrived and loaded the stolen property into his vehicle. That vehicle was allowed to leave, but was stopped on Palm Boulevard near JC Long Boulevard. He was immediately taken into custody and allowed to call a subject who was to pay him for the equipment with 2 grams of cocaine. The subject arrived and met with the subject already in custody, and was arrested. During his arrest he attempted and succeeded in swallowing some white powder, but most was retrieved. This subject was charged with Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Stolen Property, and DUS 3<sup>rd</sup> offense, and taken to the hospital for having swallowed illegal narcotics. The first subject taken into custody was charged with Burglary 1<sup>st</sup> degree and may have other Burglary charges forthcoming, as a result of the investigation.

May 30, 2010 At the request of the Sullivan's Island police officer on duty our agency provided an officer to assist him with 5 unruly male subjects drinking on the beach.

May 30, 2010 After an officer stopped a pick-up truck on Ocean Boulevard for having two small children in the bed of the truck, it was determined that the driver was wanted by the North Charleston Police Department. The subject was taken into custody and later turned over to a North Charleston officer.

May 31, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue where a domestic dispute had been reported. A female subject, who stated that her boyfriend had locked her out of her residence after arguing over a family matter, met the officers in the yard. The



officers spoke to both parties, where both agreed to discontinue their argument and allow the subject back into the residence.

May 31, 2010 While an officer patrolled the Connector, a vehicle was observed tailgating and weaving out of the lane of traffic several times. Once the vehicle was stopped the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from inside and observed that the driver was having issues in providing the appropriate paperwork. The driver was asked to submit to several Field Sobriety Tests but due to her extreme impaired condition, the tests were immediately suspended. The driver was transported to police headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test, where she registered a .25% level of alcohol. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

May 31, 2010 An officer stopped to investigate a vehicle parked on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue with a broken rear passenger window. The officer discovered a male subject sleeping in the back seat and woke him up. The subject owned the vehicle and had several fresh abrasions on his right hand. Due to his extreme intoxicated state and failure to follow the officer's instructions, he was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication and No Overnight Sleeping in a Vehicle.

May 31, 2010 Officers responded to the beach near the County Park where a fight had been reported with possible rival gang involvement. An officer met with several male subjects in the parking lot and met with the victim, who stated he was assaulted by being punched in the mouth on the beach by an unknown male subject. A short time later, officers responded to 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue, where a citizen reported that he had seen a male subject with a handgun in the waistband of his pants, concealed under his shirt. The officer approached the subject and immediately took control of his hands and placed them on the trunk of her police vehicle, where she found a silver .22 caliber revolver. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Unlawful Carrying of a Pistol, and Possession of Handgun with a Serial Number Obliterated. The subject was an active member of the US Army and his Command was appropriately notified.

May 31, 2010 While officers were on the beach looking for suspects in the previously reported assault, they ran the name of a possible suspect and determined that he was wanted by the Goose Creek Police Department. He was taken into custody and turned over to a Goose Creek officer.

#### **Personnel/Community Relations:**

April 30, 2010 Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe for the opening ceremony of Ptl. Newman-Nelson's graduation from the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy in Columbia, S.C.

May 21, 2010 PFC Baldrick, a certified car seat installer inspected the car seat of a resident to insure proper installation.

May 22, 2010 PFC Baldrick, a certified car seat installer assisted a resident in the proper installation of a forward-facing car seat.

May 24, 2010 At the request of Charleston County Sheriff Al Cannon, Sgt Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe at the funeral services of Deputy R. Bowen.

May 27, 2010 PFC Chavez was awarded Police Officer of the Year by the Exchange Club. He was recognized for his handling of a rash of golf cart thefts and his follow-up on a Burglary where stolen credit cards were used in North Charleston. His assistance resulted in positive identification of the suspect and eventual arrest. Chief Buckhannon, Lt. Wright, and several co-workers attended the ceremony.

May 31, 2010 For the month of May, officers discovered five businesses and five homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of one hundred forty Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol.
