Date: October 3, 2010

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of September 2010.

Patrol:

September 3, 2010 Officers responded to a residence in Forest Trail, where two separate 911 calls regarding an active domestic altercation between husband and wife were made. Both subjects were separated and the officers made the determination that the husband was the primary aggressor to the incident and charged him with Criminal Domestic Violence. Fire department First Responders were summoned to render aid to the wife, for scrapes she received.

September 7, 2010 After stopping a vehicle for an equipment violation in Wild Dunes, the officer questioned the driver about a paper tag that did not appear to be valid. By investigating further the officer determined that the driver, who did have a valid license, had never registered the vehicle since purchasing it two years ago. The driver was in possession of a forged Bill of Sale, and had no insurance on the vehicle. The driver was charged with Falsify DMV Document, Failure to Display Tag, and Operating an Uninsured Vehicle. The vehicle was towed from the scene.

September 7, 2010 An Isle of Palms Investigator stopped to assist a disabled motorist on Highway 17 in front of The Towne Center. The Investigator stayed with the motorist and requested that a Mount Pleasant Police Officer respond and while awaiting their arrival the disabled vehicle began to smoke from under the hood. The motorist opened the hood and flames erupted. The Investigator retrieved her fire extinguisher and doused the flames.

September 10, 2010 A Sullivan's Island Police Officer requested assistance at a serious rollover accident on Middle Street to assist with conduct traffic direction while the accident was investigated.

September 11, 2010 An Isle of Palms Police Officer accompanied two Mount Pleasant Police Officers to a residence on Charleston Boulevard to assist in the service of an Arrest Warrant for a resident, who was not at home when the officers arrived.

September 12, 2010 The Isle of Palms Fire Department requested Police Department personnel to assist with two individuals who were stranded on their third floor balcony. Rather than force the door open, Fire Department personnel used a ladder to rescue the stranded subjects.

September 12, 2010 Just before 6 P.M., officers responded to a citizens report that a group on motorcycles were driving recklessly on the Connector and were now on the Front Beach. An officer pulled the four motorcycles over at Ocean Boulevard and Pavilion Drive. A check of DMV Records showed an active suspension for one of the riders, who was taken into custody. He was charged with DUS 2nd offense and Use/Possession of Another's DL. That motorcycle was towed and the three remaining riders were allowed to leave the area. After the motorcycles dispersed, the officer observed a clear plastic bag containing five individually wrapped bags of white powder near where the motorcycles were parked. Since the officer was unable to determine who dropped the substance it was taken into custody and lodged into evidence for analysis.

September 12, 2010 An officer on patrol of the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver discovered that his license was suspended for failure to have insurance on his vehicle. He was charged with Speeding, Operating an Uninsured Motor Vehicle, and DUS.

September 14, 2010 During the course of several theft investigations in Wild Dunes an Investigator developed a person of interest that needed to be questioned. When a criminal history was checked on the suspect to be questioned it indicated that he was wanted by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office for Contempt of Family Court. When he arrived at the Public Safety Building for his interview he was taken into custody and turned over to a Deputy for incarceration.

September 15, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle near the main gate to Wild Dunes for having a cracked windshield. The officer speaking to the driver suspected that the driver was hiding something illegal and obtained consent to search and found a quantity of marijuana under the drivers seat. The driver was given a written warning for the windshield and was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

September 16, 2010 Officers responded to a report of an assault in progress at a residence on Waterway Boulevard. Upon the officer's arrival, two male subjects were separated and witnesses were interviewed, resulting in the arrest of a male subject for Assault.

September 18, 2010 An officer responded to East Cooper Hospital to meet with a female subject who reported that she was sexually assaulted on the beach on the Isle of Palms. A second sexual assault occurred in the suspect's vehicle at an unknown location,

later determined to be in Mount Pleasant. The officer confirmed where the original assault occurred and proceeded to take a written statement, where the victim identified the suspect as a male acquaintance from Mount Pleasant. The victim was transferred to MUSC for more concise medical treatment and gathering of evidence. An Investigator met with the victim and family members later in the day to gather additional information. After an in depth investigation into this incident, the suspect was charged on September 28th with Criminal Sexual Conduct 3rd degree and Transfer of Beer/Wine for Underage Consumption.

September 19, 2010 An officer on foot patrol of the Front Beach encountered a male subject loudly arguing with a doorman to an establishment after being asked to leave. The officer observed that the subject was not leaving as requested and began to yell profanities in the presence of other patrons and citizens in the area. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

September 19, 2010 Officers were advised to be on the lookout for a vehicle after the driver allegedly told a family member he was going to kill himself. The vehicle was spotted by an officer and stopped on Palm Boulevard near 20th Avenue. The driver stated he had just had a heated argument with his wife and denied making any suicidal statements to her. The driver's adult daughter arrived on scene and insured that her father made it safely to his residence in Charlotte after satisfying all concerned that he was not suicidal.

September 19, 2010 Officers responded to the hotel on Grand Pavilion regarding a reported domestic dispute between husband and wife. Upon the officers arrival they determined that the couple were not married and the male subject was gathering his girlfriends property and wanted her to leave the room he had rented. Another room was arranged for occupancy and the female subject agreed to move to that room, which was accomplished without further incident.

September 21, 2010 Officers were dispatched to the area of Sparrow Drive near Waterway, where a citizen reported that two male subjects in a pick-up truck were going from door to door attempting to sell generators. An officer located the truck and spoke with the two occupants who were identified as being from the Greenville, South Carolina area. They stated they were selling one generator for \$6,000 and with that purchase you would receive a second free, along with an air compressor, a pressure washer, and a pump. Since the subjects did not have a Business License a ticket was issued for Business License Required. Both subjects were advised that they could not conduct business without a Business License, and advised accordingly.

September 23, 2010 In April, a visitor to Wild Dunes had his bicycle valued new at \$2,300 stolen from the rental unit he had been staying in. The case was closed when all leads had been exhausted. On September 21, 2010 the bicycle was located on Craig's List, posted by an Isle of Palms resident, who was presently a student at Clemson. Telephone contact was made with the suspect, the bike was returned and he was charged with Petit Larceny.

September 25, 2010 Officers responded to a Beachside Drive residence where a domestic dispute had been reported. It was determined that the couple, visiting from Ohio argued after returning from an evening out. The husband wished to leave the residence and was allowed to leave via taxi without further incident.

September 26, 2010 Officers responded to domestic disturbance at a residence on 21st Avenue. Upon the officer's arrival, they were met by the wife who reported a violent dispute with her husband the evening prior. The husband was not present at the time and the wife was referred to the Victim Advocate for follow-up. The wife stated that she was fine and only wanted to document the situation for her pending divorce.

Personnel/Community Relations:

September 1, 2010 Chief Buckhannon, Lt. Wright, Sgt. Caldwell, Sgt. Meekins and Sgt. Usry attended the monthly meeting of Keenagers at the Recreation Center. After lunch they gave a presentation of crime prevention to approximately 65 members of the group.

September 9, 2010 Sgt. Ryan received a Letter of Appreciation from the family of an Instructor at the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy for playing the bagpipes their brother's funeral.

September 10, 2010 At the request of St. John's Fire Department Chief Karl Ristow, Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe for the opening ceremony of the Charleston Area September 11th Memorial Golf Tournament benefiting the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation. Chief Ristow also sent a letter of appreciation thanking Sgt. Ryan.

September 15, 2010 PFC Baldrick, a Certified Child Safety Seat Officer, properly installed two child safety seats in two separate vehicles for citizens at the Public Safety Building.

September 16, 2010 Sgt. Caldwell and Detective Tarr received a letter of appreciation from a couple who were stranded on the Connector with car trouble. Contact was made with AAA and the couple was driven back to their residence on the Isle of Palms.

September 30, 2010 For the month of September, officers discovered four businesses and five homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of one hundred fourteen Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to businesses or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol. One notice to a residence was for not having numerical address was issued.
