Date: January 1, 2012

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of December, 2011.

(December 2: Friday)

The victim reported that a painting was stolen from his rental property. Through investigation, suspects have developed. Arrest warrants are pending further investigation and positive identification of the suspects.

(December 3: Saturday)

Unknown person(s) entered onto the property of the victim and stole watercraft attachments belonging to the victim. The boat and attachments were in the driveway of the victim's residence at the time of the larceny.

(December 5: Monday)

While conducting route patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle traveling at what appeared to be at a high rate of speed. The Officer activated the in-car radar unit and confirmed that the operator of the vehicle was traveling 70 mph in a posted 55 mph zone. After conducting a lawful traffic stop upon the vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle did not have a valid driver's license. The defendant was charged according and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

The victim of a petit larceny met with an Officer at the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building to report that unknown person(s) had stolen two, unsecured bicycles from the driveway of the residence.

Officers met with a victim at the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building in reference to items being stolen from her unsecured vehicle. The victim stated that she left her vehicle unsecured in the drive of her residence and discovered the next day that a number of personal items had been stolen from the vehicle.

(December 6: Tuesday)

An Officer on route patrol of the 1400-1500 block of Palm Boulevard observed a traffic violation. The Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle, and while speaking with the driver of the vehicle, detected a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle. After the subject was unable to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks, she was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston Detention Center, at which time the defendant refused to provide a breath sample. She was subsequently, charged with DUI and lodged into the Detention Facility.

(December 9: Friday)

While patrolling the area of the 900 block of Ocean Boulevard, an Officer observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed. After activating the in-car radar and confirming the violation, a lawful traffic stop was conducted at which time it was learned that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a driver's license. Subsequently, he was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(December 10: Saturday)

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle in reference to equipment violations. While speaking with the operator of the vehicle, the Officer observed in plain-view, a bottle of alcoholic liquor with a broken seal in close proximity to the driver. After being placed under arrest, a pre-tow inventory of the vehicle produced a green, plant-like subject which field-tested presumptive positive for THC (Marijuana). The defendant was charged accordingly and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(December 13: Tuesday)

While conducting route patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. After confirming the speed of the vehicle to be in excess of the posted 55 mph speed limit, the Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The operator of the vehicle was unable to produce a valid driver's license upon request. Subsequently, she was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

The United States Marshal's Service requested assistance from the Isle of Palms Police Department in the service of a fugitive warrant, and taking the subject into custody. After a briefing, all law enforcement Officers responded to the residence of the wanted subject. The subject was detained without incident.

(December 15: Thursday)

Officers were dispatched to an address on 30th Avenue in reference to a possible burglary in progress. The complainant advised that 2 male subjects appeared to be attempting to force entry into the garage. Prior to the arrival of Officers, the complainant further advised that the subjects had departed the scene in a Nissan Pathfinder. Officers located a vehicle, matching the description provided by the complainant, and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The complainant positively identified the subjects as the same persons that he had observed attempting to break and enter into a residence in his neighborhood. Through further investigation, it was learned that the subjects were allowed to be at the residence; however, the driver of the vehicle could not produce a valid driver's license. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(December 17: Saturday)

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a package that had been delivered to his residence at Grand Pavilion by the U. S. Postal Service, and left near his front door.

(December 18: Sunday)

Officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a possible burglary in progress. The complainant reported that she observed an unknown black male subject exiting her unsecured storage trailer, located at the rear of her business. Officers located the subject, who was found to be in possession of property belonging to the victim, taken from the storage trailer. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(December 19: Monday)

Officers met with a victim who reported that his surfboard had been stolen from his residence. Through further investigation, it was determined that the surfboard has been missing since the victim's roommate moved out. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(December 20: Tuesday)

An Officer conducting route patrol of the area of 41st Avenue and Palm Boulevard conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle after observing a seatbelt violation. A check of the operator's driver's license through the Department of Motor Vehicles database produced information that the license was suspended due to failure to maintain vehicle insurance. The driver was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(December 22: Thursday)

A victim reported that while attending a holiday party at a local establishment, unknown person(s) stole his wallet and mobile telephone from his jacket pocket. A second report of petit larceny was filed with the Police Department on 12/27/11 by an individual that was in attendance at the same party. The second victim reported that her purse, containing her mobile telephone had been stolen. After tracking a telephone call made on the second victim's

mobile phone, a suspect has developed. Both cases have been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(December 26: Monday)

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bicycle from the parking garage of the establishment where she was staying. The victim positively identified a bicycle lock found on scene as the lock that she had placed on her bicycle. The lock had not been manipulated, thus it is believed that the lock was not properly attached.

Unknown person(s) entered into a victim's unlocked vehicle, which was parked in the driveway of his Hartnett Boulevard residence, and took, and carried away his Garmin GPS unit.

(December 27: Tuesday)

Officers responded to a complaint of a suspicious person on the exterior of a residence, knocking intrusively. Upon arrival, Officers observed a verbal argument between the male subject and a female subject. The male subject advised Officers that he had arrived at the residence a few hours prior, at which time the female subject engaged him in an argument that escalated to a physical altercation when the female subject scratched him on his chin. The female subject was, subsequently, charged with Simple Assault.

(December 28: Wednesday)

A victim reported that she had placed an envelope containing a check, in her 43rd Avenue residential mailbox, to be mailed out. She later discovered that unknown person(s) had removed the check from the envelope, leaving the compromised envelope in the mailbox.

(December 30: Friday)

An employee of a local establishment reported that a male subject took, without permission, a bottle of liquor. The subject is a regular customer of the establishment, according to the complainant and witnesses. Subsequently, the subject was identified. Charges are pending.

An Officer conducting route patrol in the 2100 block of Palm Boulevard observed a vehicle with inoperable equipment. After the Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and during interview of the operator, it was determined that the driver was under the influence of alcohol. The driver was placed under arrest after he could not perform a series of standardized field tasks.

During the month of December, 2011, Officers issued 24 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 19 Victim of Crime forms completed.
